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**APPLICATION TO TANZANIAN LOCAL SUPPLIERS AND SERVICE PROVIDERS (LSSP) DATABASE FOR THE PETROLEUM SUBSECTOR DURING YEAR 2018**

**RE-ADVERTISEMENT**

**This clarification is made following an earlier advert made on 26th January 2018. It simplifies the information by providing applicants with the Background Information, Instructions to Fill out Form N-100 and the Form N-100.**

**Background**

1. The Energy and Water Utilities Regulatory Authority (EWURA) established under the Energy and Water Utilities Regulatory Authority Act, 2001 Cap. 414 of the Laws of Tanzania monitor and regulate the mid and downstream activities of the Petroleum sub-sector. Local Content is defined as the quantum of composite value added to, or created in the economy of Tanzania through deliberate utilization of Tanzanian human and material resources and services in the petroleum operations in order to stimulate the development of capabilities of the Tanzanians and to encourage local investments and participation.

2. Regulation 38 of the Petroleum (Local Content) Regulations, 2017 (GNN 197 of 5<sup>th</sup> May 2017), EWURA is mandated to maintain a database containing details of local suppliers, service providers and other entities that meet the requirements of Common Qualification System (CQS) in the petroleum industry. CQS means a sole centralized system of pre-qualified service providers in Tanzania's petroleum sub-sector based on their capacities, capabilities and local content strength to enable ranking and categorization of the service providers as well as tracking and monitoring their performance.

3. Unless otherwise justified, the database shall act as the sole medium for qualification to work or render goods and services in the oil and gas industry of Tanzania. It is worth noting, however, that this process is not intended to replace the establishment and objectives of the CQS in

the petroleum industry as a requirement under Regulation 36 of the Petroleum (Local Content) Regulations, 2017. Thus, contractors, suppliers and service providers qualified and registered by EWURA shall be upgraded automatically into CQS.

4. The legislation requires EWURA to, among other things, establish, maintain and publish annually a central database of persons involved in petroleum activities in Tanzania and prohibits any entity from providing goods, works or services for the petroleum activities unless they are registered on the LSSP database. EWURA, now, invites applications from persons and entities for registration and qualification to the Local Suppliers and Service Providers (LSSP) Database.

5. EWURA will **ONLY** consider **ONLINE APPLICATIONS** submitted through its website. Interested persons and entities are invited to visit EWURA website: [www.ewura.go.tz](http://www.ewura.go.tz) and follow the link under **LOCAL CONTENT DATABASE** to view the guidelines, instructions and a register. There is a Form No. TFN 2018 for persons and entities not yet registered on the LSSP Database for 2018. All applications should reach EWURA through e mail [info@ewura.go.tz](mailto:info@ewura.go.tz) by **28<sup>th</sup> February 2018 at 23:59 hours** East African Time.

6. Please note that applicants are required to provide EWURA with scanned and uploaded copies of the following documents-

- (a) a justification of legal status of the local supplier or service provider, including the Certificate of Incorporation or Registration in Tanzania
- (b) Tax Clearance Certificate issued by Tanzania Revenue Authority or its equivalent if incorporated outside Tanzania;
- (c) Certificate of Professional Registration certified by the Engineers Registration Board, Contractors Registration Board, Tanzania Law Society, Tanzania Insurance Regulatory Authority, Bank of Tanzania or other certifying bodies;
- (d) National Social Security Clearance Certificate for companies registered and incorporated in Tanzania issued by the National Social Security (NSSF) or any other social security fund or proof of compliance with NSSF requirements or similar arrangements for those incorporated outside Tanzania
- (e) Banker's Reference Letter.
- (f) a scope of expertise, services or specialization with regard to the Petroleum Sub-sector, including the technical capacity (personnel, machinery, and equipment) or other related infrastructures; and

- (g) a valid alien identification card or a Bio Page of a valid Passport for non-Tanzanians living in Tanzania applying as individual consultants.

Only applicants who have qualified shall be published in LSSP Database.
