

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CHAIRMAN'S STATEMENT

On behalf of the Board of Directors, I am pleased to present the Sixth Mid and Downstream Petroleum sub-sector Performance Report that highlights the performance of the sector for the year 2019. The report provides information on relevant matters in the sub-sector including legal instruments governing the sub-sector, available infrastructure, licenced operators and importation and distribution of petroleum products in the country.

In contributing to the economic growth of the country, Energy and Water Utilities Regulatory Authority (EWURA) has continued to enhance regulation of the sub-sector so as to ensure security of supply of petroleum products throughout the country and that the supplied and distributed products meet the acceptable standard. Through the year 2019, the country had sufficient petroleum products to meet the country's demand whereas available products met the minimum required stock level of 15 days. EWURA also continued to conduct regular tests of petroleum products distributed in the country and analysed samples of the same to determine their conformity to national standards set by the Tanzania Bureau of Standards (TBS) and that government taxes have been paid. Furthermore, EWURA has continued to work closely with all stakeholders to ensure there is a level playing field in the sub-sector so as to continue attracting investments and protect efficient operators.

My sincere appreciation goes to the Government of the United Republic of Tanzania under the leadership of His Excellency, President Dr. John Pombe Joseph Magufuli; the Ministry of Energy; the Ministry of Water and other stakeholders for creating a conducive environment that enabled the Authority to conduct its functions effectively and efficiently to achieve the national goals. I wish to extend my special thanks to the Ministry of Energy for supporting the Authority in achieving its intended goals pertaining to the mid and downstream petroleum sub-sector.

I thank the Management and staff of the Petroleum Bulk Procurement Agency (PBPA) and Oil Marketing Companies for their cooperation in providing the required market data to facilitate preparation of this report.

Finally, I am also grateful to my colleagues for their dedication and contribution in the success of the Authority. I commend and appeal to all to continue upholding their dedication and values of the Authority for continued success of the Authority and the petroleum sub-sector as whole.

FOREWORD

The Petroleum Act, Cap 392 and the Energy and Water Utilities Regulatory Authority (EWURA) Act, Cap. 414 mandate the Authority to regulate the mid and downstream petroleum sub-sector in Tanzania Mainland. In undertaking its regulatory roles, the Authority involves all stakeholders in the mid and downstream petroleum sub sector in order to safeguard the interest of the Government, Regulated Suppliers and the Public at large.

The Authority continued to perform its regulatory functions so as to ensure that the sub-sector performs efficiently and effectively. The Authority has strived to be predictable and transparent so as to build confidence of the investors leading to ongoing business developments and investments in the downstream petroleum sub sector. The sub-sector has observed significant increase in LPG storage and distribution facilities with increased reliability in supply of petroleum products in rural areas through reduced licencing requirements while adhering to HSE standards. The Authority has also continued to ensure that operators in the sub-sector are licenced and comply with applicable standards and legislation with petroleum products being regularly tested and analysed to determine their conformity with national standards set by the Tanzania Bureau of Standards (TBS) and that government taxes have been paid. On a monthly basis, the Authority has also published cap prices of petroleum products so that operators earn enough to provide the required services and earn a return on their investments while on the other hand customers are also assured that they purchase petroleum products at a fair price.

These developments and compliance to the sub-sector regulations have positively contributed to growth in the sub-sector and the economic growth in line with the National Economic Policies.

It is my sincere hope that, this report will provide an insight into the performance of the sector, regulatory activities conducted by EWURA as well as achievements attained and challenges encountered in the downstream petroleum sub-sector and hence provide guidance in policy and investment decisions.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The Petroleum Performance Sector Report for 2019 is the sixth sector report to be prepared by EWURA. The report details key information related to the mid and downstream petroleum sub-sector. This includes regulatory instruments and standards governing operations in the sub-sector, available receiving and distribution petroleum infrastructure, importation and sales quantities, prices of petroleum products, licensing activities and compliance monitoring. The report also highlights key achievements in sector regulation as well as challenges and strategies to improve the performance of the sub-sector.

Key petroleum infrastructure in the mid and down stream sub-sector are berthing facilities, storage terminals and distribution facilities. Berthing facilities include Kurasini Oil Jetties (KOJ) and the Single Bouy Mooring (SBM) at Dar es Salaam port as well as jetties at Tanga and Mtwara Ports. Total operational storage capacities for liquid petroleum is 1,180,275 cubic meters. As of 31st December 2019 there were 1,581 operational petrol stations in the country whereby most of them are located in urban areas. Despite an increase in the demand for petroleum products in rural areas, there is still limited investments in petrol stations in these areas. The Government is analysing various options to attract investments in petrol stations in rural areas so as to ensure petroleum products are supplied there in an environment that is safe to humans and the environment. Also, LPG operational receiving and storage capacity more than doubled in 2019 to a reported storage capacity of 17,000MT.

Bulk Procurement System (BPS) continued to be the only means of procuring petrol, diesel, Jet A1 and kerosene with Dar es Salaam, Tanga and Mtwara ports being the only receiving entries for BPS cargoes. In the year under review, 92 BPS tenders were floated which is an increase of 10 tenders when compared to those floated in 2018. The weighted average premium for the year under review stood at 29.29 USD/MT, 31.34 USD/MT, and 46.31 USD/MT for petrol, diesel and Jet A1 / kerosene, which is equivalent to an increase of 15%, 37% and 26%, respectively. Changes in premiums throughout the year under review were a result of competition in the BPS tenders.

The security of supply of petroleum products in the country continued to be maintained. On average, OMCs had petroleum stock sufficient to cater the country's requirements for more than 20 days which is above the 15 days stipulated in the Petroleum General Regulations. In the year 2019, a total of 6,153,571,595 litres of petroleum products (diesel, petrol, kerosene, Jet A1 and HFO) were imported into the country, which is a 7% increase compared to imported products in the year 2018. From the imported petroleum products, 57% were for local consumption while the remaining 43% was transited to neighbouring countries mainly being Zambia, Democratic Republic of Congo (DRC), Rwanda, Malawi and Burundi. On the other hand, total LPG imported in year 2019 stood at 166,436 MT which is equivalent to an increase of 16%. In the same year, there was a 3% increase in imported and locally manufactured lubricants which amounted to 45,315,291 litres.

The average crude oil prices in the world market in year 2019 was reported to be 63.93 USD/BBL which is a 10.5% decrease from the recorded price in 2018. The decrease in crude oil was mainly due to increased oil production from non-OPEC countries particularly the United States of America while demand for oil was lower mainly because of the economic slowdown in China.

The average FOB prices for refined petroleum products in the world market in the period under review was 593 USD/MT, 570 USD/MT and 589 USD/MT for petrol, diesel

and kerosene respectively which is equivalent to a decrease of 10%, 8% and 9% when compared to prices of 2018. Local prices ex Dar es Salaam also declined whereas petrol prices decreased by 5% while prices of diesel and kerosene declined by 3% each.

Most of the petroleum facilities in urban areas meet the required standards. In the year 2019, the Authority continued to inspect petroleum facilities to ensure that the facilities are in compliance with the required standards. A total of 531 petroleum product facilities were inspected during the year under review, out of which 490 facilities were operating. Out of the operating facilities, 372 facilities, equivalent to 76% complied with standards. The Authority closed petroleum facilities in urban areas that did not meet required standards. Operators were required to rectify the shortfalls before lifting the closure. On the other hand, petroleum facilities in rural areas that did not meet the required standards were allowed to continue with operations while the observed shortfalls were being rectified by the operators. However, where the shortfalls were related to HSE issues, the petroleum facilities in rural areas were also closed with operators being required to rectify shortfalls before lifting the closure. Regular compliance monitoring and enforcement inspections coupled with public awareness campaigns will continue to be conducted until compliance is raised to 100%.

The Authority continued to collect petroleum products samples from different facilities (petrol stations, depots and trucks) for laboratory quality analysis in order to see that petroleum products distributed in the country meet the required quality standards. In year 2019, the Authority collected a total of 280 samples, out of which 30 samples, equivalent to 10.3% did not conform to TBS specifications. On the other hand, in combating tax evasion and providing quality assurance, the Authority continued to implement the fuel marking programme. During the period under review, a total of 3.25 billion litres of PMS, AGO and IK were marked which is an increase of 7% compared to 3.05 billion litres marked in year 2018. In the same period, samples were taken from 718 petrol stations whereas 23 petrol stations equivalent to 3.2% failed marker tests which is an improvement compared to 5.85% failure for year 2018. The Authority took legal actions to the operators found with products that are out of TBS specifications and the ones found with products that failed marker tests. The Authority will continue to undertake sampling and testing of petroleum products so that the level of compliance is 100%.

The key achievements attained by the sub-sector in 2019 include continued improvement and efficiency in BPS, increased investments in storage facilities especially in LPG infrastructure, decreased level of dumping and tax evasion on transit petroleum products.

Challenges which were encountered by the sub-sector include low infrastructure investments in rural areas attributable mainly to high investment costs coupled with low sales resulting in a long period of recouping investments, low public awareness on matters related to HSE in the petroleum sub-sector and lack of knowledge and expertise in the downstream petroleum sub-sector operations with a knowledge gap particularly observed from petrol stations operators.

In preparing this report, data and information was obtained from various stakeholders including OMCs, Global Fluid International (GFI), Weights and Measure Agency (WMA), Petroleum Bulk Procurement Agency (PBPA), Tanzania Bureau of Standards (TBS), Tanzania Ports Authority (TPA), Tanzania Revenue Authority (TRA) and other government and non-government sources, Platts and the Authority's database and reports.

1. INTRODUCTION

This is the sixth Mid and Downstream Petroleum Sub-sector Performance Review Report. The report contains data and information that can be used by all stakeholders including Government Institutions, investors and the general public. It provides regulatory instruments which are the key tools for undertaking regulatory activities in the sub-sector. It also provides standards for petroleum products and petroleum infrastructure used by the Authority as benchmarks for carrying out inspections and compliance monitoring. Furthermore, the report covers infrastructure used in the sub-sector in handling, storage and distribution of petroleum products. These include offloading facilities, oil storage terminals, LPG storage facilities, transportation facilities, petrol stations and lubricant blending plants.

It presents the performance of licensing activities which involve evaluation of licence and construction approval applications, pre-licensing inspections and issuance of licences. Further, it covers the performance in compliance monitoring and enforcement that include: Petroleum Products Quality, Petroleum Products Supply in the country, Cap Price monitoring, incident investigations, Health, Safety and Environment (HSE) requirements monitoring. The report also provides details of petroleum products importation, world market price movements, petroleum product prices, petroleum products supply chain, petroleum stock distribution in the country and competition in the sub-sector. Last but not least, the report provides key achievements attained and challenges facing the sub-sector.

2. REGULATORY INSTRUMENTS AND STANDARDS

EWURA is guided by various legal instruments and standards to perform its regulatory functions in the Mid and Downstream Petroleum Sub-sector. These instruments include: The National Energy Policy 2015, the Petroleum Act, Cap 392, EWURA Act Cap 414 and other cross-cutting regulatory instruments. In the course of performing its duties, EWURA exercises transparency, effectiveness and efficiency in a manner that ensures quality, availability and affordability of regulated services. EWURA has also adopted ISO 9001:2015 Standard, Quality Management System to ensure that, delivery of regulatory services meet stakeholders' expectations.

2.1. Legislations

The Mid and Downstream Petroleum Sub-sector is regulated by The Petroleum Act, 2015 Cap 392, EWURA Act Cap 414 and subsidiary legislations which include:

Furthermore, the Authority drafted the Petroleum (Mobile Petrol Station Operation) Rules, which are also under review.

2.2. Petroleum Products and Infrastructure Standards

The statutory body whose main responsibility, among others, include formulation of standards is Tanzania Bureau of Standards (TBS). Among the standards that are formulated by TBS include the petroleum products and infrastructure standards that are then adopted by EWURA. In absence of the National standards, International standards are used.

Pursuant to Section 30(2)(b) of the Petroleum Act, Cap. 392, EWURA is mandated to monitor petroleum products' quality and standards. In developing the standards, TBS involves all key stakeholders at all stages. The National applicable petroleum products and petroleum infrastructure standards in Tanzania Mainland are presented in **Appendices 1 and 2** respectively.

In year 2019, TBS reviewed 10 petroleum products standards as shown below:

- (a) TZS 2310:2018 – Petroleum and Natural Gas Industries – Pipeline Transportation Systems – Pipeline Valves;
- (b) TZS 675:2018 Multipurpose automotive gear lubricant (EP) – Specification;
- (c) TZS 667:2018 Motor vehicles brake fluids – Specification;
- (d) TZS 1691:2018 Automatic Transmission Fluids (ATF) based on road vehicles – Specification;
- (e) TZS 871:2018 Test methods for determination of motor vehicles brake fluids;
- (f) TZS 1074:2009 / ISO 12922:2012 Lubricants, industrial oils and related products (class L) -- Family H (Hydraulic systems) -- Specifications for hydraulic fluids in categories HFAE, HFAS, HFB, HFC, HFDR and HFDU;
- (g) TZS 1073:2018/SO 15380:2016 Lubricants, industrial oils and related products (class L) -- Family H (Hydraulic systems) -- Specifications for hydraulic fluids in categories HETG, HEPG, HEES and HEPR;
- (h) TZS 1072:2018/ISO 11158:2009 Lubricants, industrial oils and related products (class L) -- Family H (hydraulic systems) -- Specifications for categories HH, HL, HM, HV and HG (Rev TZS 1072:2008);
- (i) TZS 1065:2018 /ISO 3448:1992 Industrial liquid lubricants -- ISO viscosity classification (Rev TZS 1065:2008); and
- (j) TZS 1066(4):2018 /ISO 6743-4:2015 Lubricants, industrial oils and related products (class L) -- Classification -- Part 4: Family H (Hydraulic systems).

Two standards namely FTZS 2260:2018 High Performance Engine Lubricating for Diesel Engines - Specification and FTZS 2261:2018 High Performance Engine Lubricating for Petrol Engines - Specification are in the final stages of completion.

In the year under review, TBS in collaboration with key stakeholders developed various lubricants oil standards that have been circulated to the public for comments. The standards include:

- (a) CDC 17(5817) P3 – Lubricating grease – Specification;
- (b) CDC 17(5817) P3 – Lubricants, industrial oils and related products (class L) – Family T (Turbines) – Specification for Lubricating Oils for Turbines;
- (c) CDC 17(6218) P3 – Lubricants, industrial oils and related products (class L) – Family E (Internal combustion engine oils) – Specification for two- stroke cycle gasoline engine oils (categories EGB, EGC and EGD);
- (d) CDC 17 (6219) P3 – Lubricants. Industrial oils and related products (class L) – Classification – Part 6: Family C (gear systems);
- (e) CDC 17(6220) P3 – Lubricants, industrial oils and related products (class L) – Family C (gears) – part 1: Specifications for lubricants for enclosed gear systems; and
- (f) CDC 17 (6222) P3 – Lubricants, industrial oils and related products (class L) – Classification – Part 99: General.

In year 2019, EWURA continued to monitor compliance with the petroleum products quality and infrastructure standards. Legal actions were taken against non-compliants.

3. PETROLEUM INFRASTRUCTURE

3.1. Offloading/Receiving Facilities

All of the petroleum products requirements for Tanzania are imported and received through berthing facilities located at three main ports namely; Dar es Salaam, Tanga and Mtwara. However, some imports of lubricants are received through the border entry points, mainly being the Sirari, Holili and Tunduma borders.

Dar es Salaam port consists of three berthing facilities which are the Single Buoy Mooring (SBM) used to offload diesel and crude oil; Kurasini Oil Jetty 1 (KOJ1) used to offload petrol, Heavy Fuel Oil (HFO), kerosene and Jet A-1; and Kurasini Oil Jetty 2 (KOJ2) used to offload LPG and backloading liquid petroleum products. In addition to its use in offloading petroleum products, KOJ1 is also used in offloading Vegetable Oil.

Petroleum products received at Mtwara port are Diesel and Petrol. The petroleum products received through this port are intended to serve the requirements of the Southern regions of Mtwara, Lindi and Ruvuma. As for Tanga port, the petroleum products received are diesel, petrol, kerosene and LPG. The products are aimed at meeting the requirements of the Northern regions of Tanga, Kilimanjaro, Manyara and Arusha.

The berthing facilities at Dar es Salaam and Tanga are also used to receive petroleum products transited to the neighbouring landlocked countries of Zambia, Uganda, DRC, Malawi, Rwanda, and Burundi.

Each facility/port has its maximum safe operating capacity for handling berthing vessels based on Dead Weight Tonnage (DWT) as detailed in **Table 1**.

3.2 Petroleum Storage Terminals

3.2.1 Receiving terminals

Tanzania Mainland has a total of 21 operational petroleum receiving terminals located around Dar es Salaam, Tanga and Mtwara ports with total storage capacity of 1,178,125 cubic metres. These terminals receive petroleum products directly from berthing facilities and can store products to meet the country's demand of about 115 days. **Appendix 3** presents the storage capacities of receiving terminals. There is another terminal at Tanga with a capacity of receiving a total of 7,200 cubic meters which is not operational. The terminal may be used for receiving petroleum products if it is rehabilitated and gets connected to the receiving manifold.

3.2.2 Inland storage depot

There are 29 upcountry inland storage depots with total storage capacity of 75,626 cubic metres. These depots are located in towns or cities where there is or there was a railway service with products from the receiving terminal being delivered to the depots by the use of railway wagons and trucks. However, most of these depots are non-operational because distribution of petroleum products is now mainly through road tankers that can supply directly to the retail outlets or final users. The storage capacities of inland depots are presented in **Appendix 4**.

3.2.3 TAZAMA receiving terminal

TAZAMA Pipelines Limited (TAZAMA) is a company that was incorporated for the purpose of transporting crude oil or refined petroleum products from Dar es Salaam port to Zambia. The Government of Tanzania has 33.3% of the company shareholding and the Government of Zambia owns 66.7% shares. TAZAMA owns, operates and maintains a receiving terminal at Kigamboni district in Dar es Salaam with a total storage capacity of 232,000 cubic metres.

3.3 Transportation Infrastructure

In the petroleum industry, petroleum and petroleum products are normally transported by pipeline, rail, trucks or ship. The most common mode of transport in Tanzania Mainland is road tankers which are used for distributing petroleum products from the receiving terminals of Dar es Salaam, Mtwara and Tanga to consumers and

neighboring countries. The railway is also used to transport petroleum products from Tanga port to Kigoma.

While there is no pipeline for transporting petroleum products within the country, TAZAMA owns, operates and maintains a pipeline that has a total length of 1,710 km and a throughput of 1,100 MT per annum. The pipeline runs from Dar es Salaam port to Indeni refinery in Zambia whereby it is currently used to transport crude oil needed at the refinery. Transportation of crude oil is achieved through seven pump stations¹ five of which are located in Tanzania Mainland at Dar es Salaam, Morogoro, Mikumi, Iringa and Mbeya.

During the period under review, TAZAMA rehabilitated two (2) crude oil storage tanks (Tank no. 1 and Tank no. 5) and replaced pumps and engines at Mbeya and Morogoro so as to protect the environment from oil leaks and improve the pump discharge. All the rehabilitation works were on the Tanzanian side.

3.4 Petrol Stations

As of 31st December 2019 there were 1,596 operational petrol stations in the country compared to 1,460 reported in the previous year, equivalent to an increase of 9.32%. An increase in the number of petrol stations is attributed to increased demand of petroleum products, growth in economic activities and increased road networks. Most of the petrol stations are located in urban areas despite the fact that there is an emerging demand of petroleum products in rural areas.

EWURA has continued to encourage construction of petrol stations in rural areas so as to ensure that petroleum products are distributed to such areas in a reliable and safe manner. Thus, the Petroleum (Retail Operations in Townships and Villages) Rules 2017 continue to be applicable where the requirements for constructing a petrol station in rural areas have been lessened to reduce investment costs while still adhering to HSE requirements. **Table 2** presents the number of petrol stations in each region.

During the period under review, 18 OMCs owned a network of petrol stations in various parts of the country totalling 475 petrol stations equivalent to 30% of the total number of petrol stations in the country. Lake Oil is the OMC with the largest network of petrol stations amounting to 84 followed by TOTAL Tanzania Ltd and Oilcom with 81 and 48 petrol stations respectively. The number of petrol stations owned by OMCs in each region is as shown in **Appendix 5**.

3.5 LPG Facilities

Investors in the mid and downstream sub-sector continued to invest in the LPG industry. The LPG receiving facilities that were reported in year 2018 to be at final stages of completion were completed and put into operation in year 2019. These were the Taifa Gas and Manjis Gas Supply Co. Ltd LPG facilities that were being constructed at Kigamboni area with storage capacities of 6,000 MT and 2,700 MT respectively. Therefore, in the year 2019, the total operational storage capacity of LPG receiving facilities in Dar es Salaam and Tanga stood at 15,750 MT compared to 8,273 MT in year 2018, equivalent to a growth of 90.4%. A list of operational LPG receiving facilities in Dar es Salaam and Tanga is shown in **Table 3**. In addition, there are LPG receiving facilities that are no longer operational. These include one for Oryx Gas located at Kurasini with a capacity of 1,250 MT; one for Cam Gas located at Kurasini with a capacity of 100 MT; and one for Taifa Gas located in Tanga with a capacity of 23 MT.

Similarly, in the period under review, investors continued to invest in upcountry storage and filling plants by either constructing new or expanding the existing facilities to cater for the growing LPG demand in the country. In year 2018 total storage capacity of LPG facilities upcountry was 1,522 MT compared to 1,671 MT in the year under review which is equivalent to a 9.7% growth. **Appendix 6** depicts a list of upcountry LPG facilities with their respective storage capacities.

4. PETROLEUM PRODUCTS SUPPLY AND STOCK MONITORING

The Authority has a role of ensuring petroleum supply in the country meets demands. Regulation 6 of the Petroleum (General) Regulations, 2011 GN. No. 163 requires each Petroleum Wholesaler to maintain a physical operation stock in quantities of not less than 15 days requirement. In achieving that requirement in the year under review, the Authority conducted stock simulation to ensure that, petroleum quantities ordered for the coming two months is sufficient. The simulation process intended to establish a balance of BPS cargoes planned to be procured under BPS tenders with the country petroleum products consumption rate for each product. Furthermore, every Friday of the week all Oil Marketing Companies (OMCs) were submitting stock reports of key products including Petrol, Diesel, Kerosene, JetA1, Heavy Fuel Oil (HFO) and Liquefied Petroleum Products (LPG). The stock reports indicated operational balances as required in the regulations. The Petroleum General Regulations require the consumption rate to be obtained from previous year Petroleum Wholesalers' sales for each products so as to establish the magnitude of the country petroleum demand for the year in consideration.




Figure 1: Average Weekly Stock Days for Petrol, Diesel and Kerosene in 2019




Figure 2: Average Weekly Stock Days for LPG, Jet A1 and HFO 180 in 2019

The Authority continued to monitor OMC's stock balances on a weekly basis. The stock balances in the year under review indicate that petroleum stocks were above 15 days except in October 2019 where petrol stock slipped slightly below 15 days as indicated in **Figure 1**. In order to ensure there is security of supply of all petroleum products, the Authority informed PBPA of the available stock of petrol and instructed them to increase the volume of orders of the product. As a result, in November 2019, stocks of petrol were increased to the required levels and have remained at adequate levels thereafter. Despite the slight drop in petrol stock levels, there was no shortage of petroleum products in the country. **Figure 1** and **Figure 2** show the average weekly stock days in a given month for the key petroleum products.

4.1 Bulk Procurement System (BPS) Monitoring

Bulk Procurement System (BPS) continued to be a means of procuring key petroleum products in the country through Dar es Salaam, Tanga and Mtwara ports. The key products are petrol, diesel, kerosene and Jet A1. Although the Petroleum (Bulk Procurement) Regulations require that LPG and HFO be procured through BPS, the two products are still procured by companies through individual private arrangement. The Government through the Ministry of Energy and other key stakeholders are still discussing the best way of procuring LPG through BPS to attain the intended economic benefits. On the other hand, HFO demand has continued to decrease following the increased use of natural gas. If demand for the product continues to decline, the product could continue to be procured under individual private arrangements. Other petroleum products that are also procured through individual private arrangements include lubricants, baseoil, petcoke and bitumen.

4.1.1 BPS Suppliers and Premiums




Figure 3: Weighted Average Premiums in 2018 and 2019

Ninety two (92) BPS contracts were awarded in year 2019 compared to eighty two (82) BPS contracts that were awarded in 2018. The contracts were awarded to the lowest bidder following a competitive international BPS tender. The weighted average premium² for the year under review stood at 31.34 USD/MT, 29.29 USD/MT and 46.31 USD/MT for diesel, petrol, Jet A-1/Kerosene respectively compared to 22.84 USD/MT, 25.43 USD/MT, and 36.70 USD/MT in year 2018 for diesel, petrol and Jet A-1/Kerosene respectively. The changes are equivalent to an increase of 37%, 15% and 26%, respectively. Despite the average increase in premiums, the market observed for the first time negative premiums in two BPS tenders and premiums of less than 4 USD/MT in six BPS tenders as shown in Appendix 7. **Table 4** indicates a summary of the companies that won the BPS tenders during the year under review whereas **Figure 3** provides the annual weighted average premiums for petrol, diesel and kerosene for the year 2018 and 2019. Details of the winning bidders for each BPS tender and the corresponding premiums are shown in **Appendix 7**.

Petroleum products received through Tanga and Mtwara ports attain relatively higher premiums than those in Dar es Salaam as shown in Table 5. Such high premiums are attributed to various factors including low volumes of petroleum products procured through the two ports and the increased freight rate resulting from one vessel carrying more than one product and having to deliver products to more than one port. Following the opening of the Mtwara transit route, it is expected that volumes procured through Mtwara port will increase and hence reduce the premiums for Tanga and Mtwara. Monthly weighted average premium per port for each product is presented in **Appendix 8**.

4.2 Petroleum Products Imports

All the key petroleum products that are imported into Tanzania are received through Dar es Salaam, Tanga and Mtwara ports.

4.2.1 Main Petroleum Products imports

The main petroleum products imported into the country are petrol, diesel, kerosene, Jet A1 and HFO. During the period under review, a total of 6,153,571,595 litres were imported which is a 7.9% increase compared to 5,704,810,644 litres imported in year 2018. Imported quantities for each product is presented in **Appendix 9**.


The volume imported for domestic use in year 2019 was 3,537,891,891 litres which is an increase of 8.4% compared to 3,264,785,479 litres imported in year 2018. This increase is attributed mainly to an increase of diesel and petrol imported during the year 2019 compared to the previous year whereby the volume of diesel and petrol increased by 12% and 7% respectively. The main driver for this increase is the increased use of petroleum products in the ongoing government projects including the construction of roads, Standard Gauge Railway project and Mwalimu Nyerere Hydro Power Project. In addition, fuel was highly needed in the agricultural sector amid high farming activities due to a favourable rainy season. According to PwC- 2019/20 budget review, the construction and agricultural sectors contributed to about 13% and 28% to GDP respectively. The quantity of petroleum product imported during the year under review is detailed in **Appendix 9**.

The volume imported for transit to the neighbouring countries stood at 2,615,679,703 litres which is equivalent to an increase of 7.2% compared to 2,440,025,165 litres in year 2018. This increase is attributed mainly to the increased consumption in the neighbouring countries as well as continued efficiency of BPS, efficiency of the Dar es Salaam and Tanga ports which attracted oil marketers in neighbouring landlocked countries to use the Tanzania transit routes for importation of petroleum products.

Table 6 and **Figure 4** indicate local and transit imports in year 2019 and 2018.

Despite a stable aviation traffic in 2019, the quantity of Jet A-1 imported for local consumption decreased by 18%. The decline in importation of Jet A-1 is attributable mainly to a higher available stock at the beginning of the year 2019 and the use of fuel efficient planes by some of the airlines hence resulting in reduced demand for the fuel. Likewise, HFO importation decreased by 4% due to the continued increase in the use of natural gas for industrial heating and power generation resulting in a decrease in the demand for HFO. Analysis of fuel consumption is further elaborated in Chapter 4.3.

4.2.2 LPG Imports and Consumption




Figure 5: LPG Imports from 2010 to 2019

The LPG business segment continued to grow in the year under review with increased imports and investments in storage and refilling plants. LPG imported in year 2019 was 166,436 MT compared to 142,939 MT imported in year 2018, equivalent to 16% increase. About 65% of the imported quantity is used in the domestic market while the remaining 35% is destined for transit to neighbouring countries. Transits to Kenya account for 70% of the total LPG transit business. The increase in LPG imported quantity is due to efforts by the Government and LPG marketing companies to create awareness to the public on the importance of using LPG instead of using traditional fuels such as charcoal, firewoods and kerosene. Despite the increased LPG consumption in the country, there is still limited distribution of the product in rural areas. More effort is needed by LPG supplier to develop affordable distribution

mechanism to cater for the low income earners so that they can afford and access the use of LPG. **Figure 5** indicates the LPG imports trend from year 2010 to 2019.

4.2.3 Imported and Locally Blended Lubricants

In the year under review, the Authority continued to regulate the lubricant business in Tanzania by issuing licences to companies engaged in importation and local blending of lubricants. In order to monitor and control importation of lubricant products in the country, any company requiring custom clearance of lubricant consignment should have EWURA Lubricant Wholesale Licence.

The lubricants consumed in the country during the year under review was 45,315,291 litres compared to 43,855,116 litres in year 2018, equivalent to an increase of 3%. Out of total consumed lubricants, 81% was locally blended and 19% was imported as finished products. This is a result of increased investments in lubricants blending plants whereby there are currently six (6) plants in Tanzania.

The market shares are led by Total (T) Ltd (33%), Oryx Services and Specialities (17%), General Petroleum Ltd (11%), Mineral Oil Ltd (11%), Mogas Tanzania Ltd (10%), Lake lubes Ltd (2%) and other smaller importers (15%). The market shares are a close estimates in combination of imported and blended lubricants. **Table 8** shows the combined quantities of lubricants imported and locally blended in year 2018 and 2019.

4.3 Main Petroleum Products Consumption

Petroleum products consumption was determined based on the sales data obtained from wholesalers and GFI. The data forms basis for monitoring supply chain and distribution of imported products to various markets so as to strike a balance between supply and demand. Consumption in year 2019 was 3,631,794,202 litres which is equivalent to 8.5% increase compared to 3,347,660,127 litres consumed in year 2018. **Table 9** shows the trend of petroleum products consumption in year 2018 and 2019.

Industry and agriculture followed by transportation category were the biggest consumer of main petroleum products which amounted to 44.48% and 43.97% of the country consumption respectively. Household and power generation consumed the least (0.27% and 0.58% respectively).

4.3.1 Petrol Station Sales Density

Dar es Salaam and Mwanza continued to have the highest annual average sales per petrol station followed by Iringa, Mbeya and Arusha with average annual sales of 2,261,498 litres, 1,544,838 litres, 1,336,378 litres, 1,186,680 litres and 1,020,949 litres respectively. Most of the petrol stations are located in urban areas leaving rural areas underserved. The rural areas are also devoid of safe petroleum distribution infrastructure. EWURA has made initiatives to enhance investment of low-cost petrol stations for safe distribution of petroleum products in rural areas. These initiatives include development of the Petroleum (Retail Operations in Townships and Villages) Rules 2017 specific for regulating rural petrol stations and issuance of conditional licences which allow operators to continue offering services while upgrading their petrol stations to fully meet required standards without jeopardising HSE matters. In addition, EWURA issued guidance for construction of low cost petrol stations.

4.3.2 Aviation Fuel Consumption and Distribution

Aviation fuels comprise of Jet A-1 and AvGas that are mainly used to run aircrafts for local and international flights. Similar to other petroleum products, the Authority has a role of ensuring availability of aviation fuels to meet airports fuel demands. In the year under review, only three active petroleum wholesalers supplied aviation fuels at airports, namely Puma Energy (T) Ltd, Total (T) Ltd and Oilcom (T) Ltd. A total of 217,396,436 litres of Jet A-1 and 562,199 litres of Avgas were distributed and consumed at various airports. Most of Jet A-1 sales are made at Julius Nyerere International Airport (JNIA in Dar es Salaam) with 70% of the total Jet A-1 sales being made at JNIA and 100% of AvGas also sold to aircrafts that refuel at JNIA. Kilimanjaro International Airport and Abeid Amani Karume International Airport in Zanzibar consumed 11% and 12% of Jet A-1 respectively, while the rest of airports consumed the remaining portion. While the frequency of local flights to various airports increased and new routes introduced, most of the aircraft refuel at JNIA.




Figure 6: Jet A-1 Consumption and Distribution by Airport and Company

5. PETROLEUM PRODUCTS PRICES REGULATION

Pursuant to section 166 of the Petroleum Act, Cap 392 EWURA is mandated to monitor prices of petroleum products. This is done by monitoring the price of crude oil under the Brent Crude price benchmark, the price of refined petroleum products as published by Platts and the premiums obtained from the BPS tenders. The Authority publishes petroleum wholesale and retail cap prices for petrol, diesel and kerosene on a monthly basis according to the Energy and Water Utilities Regulatory Authority (Petroleum Products Price Setting) Rules.

Despite amendment of the Rules towards the end of 2018 to include an LPG pricing formula, the Authority did not start LPG price regulation following postponement of implementation of BPS in procurement of the product. EWURA will continue to monitor LPG prices and where the need arises, the Authority will commence LPG price regulation.

5.1 Crude Oil Prices




Figure 7: World Market Crude Oil Price trend in 2018 and 2019




Figure 8: Average Blent Crude Oil Prices in 2018 and 2019

In the year under review, crude oil prices decreased by 10% compared to those in 2018. The average price of crude oil in 2019 stood at 63.93 USD/BBL compared to 71.43 USD/BBL in 2018. The trend of crude oil prices at the world market are shown in **Figure 7** whereas the average oil prices for year 2018 and 2019 are indicated in **Figure 8**.

Slump in crude oil prices in the year 2019 is attributed to growth in supply from non-OPEC countries such as United States of America, Brazil, Canada, Norway, Guyana. The United States of America became a net exporter of crude oil turning the country into the world's largest crude oil producer. The growth in supply was attained despite reduced oil production from OPEC countries, attacks on Saudi Arabian oil infrastructure, production outages from Libya and sanctions imposed by USA on Iran and Venezuela that limited oil exports from the two countries (IEA – Market report 2019).

5.2 World Market Prices of Refined Petroleum Products


As the petroleum products can be procured from different various oil markets and on varying terms, the Shipping and Supply Contracts specify the basis of the price of procuring the products. Products procured through BPS are priced under the Free on Board incoterm where the price of the product excludes the shipping costs. Shipping costs are included in the premium tendered by the suppliers. Despite the use of the FOB incoterm in pricing, the petroleum products are delivered under the Delivery At Place incoterm where the supplier is responsible for delivery of the products ready for unloading at any specific place of delivery within the three ports as specified in the Shipping and Supply Contract. The reference price for petroleum products procured through BPS is as follows:

- (a) For petrol it is the average European marketscan Platts quotation for a given month under the quote "mean FOB Med cargo for gasoline prem unleaded 10ppmS";
- (b) For diesel it is the average European marketscan Platts quotation for a given month under the quote "mean FOB Arab Gulf cargo for Gasoil 0.005% S (50ppm); and
- (c) For Jet A1 and kerosene it is the average European marketscan Platts quotation for a given month under the quote "mean FOB Arab Gulf cargo for Jet A1 and Kerosene".

In the year under review, the average FOB prices for refined petroleum products stood at 593 USD/MT, 570 USD/MT and 589 USD/MT for petrol, diesel and Jet A1/ kerosene, respectively compared to 661 USD/MT, 622 USD/MT and 646 USD/MT in year 2018. The recorded price is equivalent to a 10%, 8% and 9% decrease in petrol, diesel and Jet A1/ kerosene prices, respectively, compared to the average FOB prices recorded in year 2018. The world market FOB prices for petrol, diesel and Jet A1/ kerosene are shown in **Table 12** and **Figure 9**.

5.3 Domestic Petroleum Product Prices

In year 2019, domestic wholesale and retail prices for petrol, diesel and kerosene were published monthly for all districts in Tanzania Mainland depending on the cost of the products received through each port.




Figure 10: Average retail cap price for Dar es Salaam in 2018 and 2019

Petroleum prices for petrol, diesel and kerosene were TShs 2,200/litre, TShs 2,159/litre and TShs 2,114/litre ex Dar es Salaam implying a decrease of 5%, 3% and 3% respectively compared to average pump prices in year 2018. The decrease of average local prices is due to the decrease in the FOB price of refined petroleum products in the world market. **Table 13** and **Figure 10** show the average retail cap prices for Dar es Salaam in year 2018 and 2019.

In the year under review, the average retail prices per litre ex Tanga for petrol, diesel and kerosene were TShs 2,234/litre, TShs 2,200/litre and TShs 2,161/litre, equivalent to a decrease of -2%, 1% and 1% respectively compared to average pump prices in year 2018. **Table 14** and **Figure 10** show the average retail cap prices for Tanga in year 2018 and 2019.




Figure 11: Average retail cap price for Tanga in 2018 and 2019

In the same period, the average retail cap prices in Mtwara for petrol, diesel and kerosene were TShs 2,242/litre and TShs 2,205/litre and TShs 2,180/litre equivalent to a decrease of 7% each for petrol and diesel prices when compared to those that prevailed in 2018 while kerosene increased by 2% as indicated in **Table 15**.




Figure 12: Average retail cap price for Mtwara 2018 and 2019

5.3.1 Exchange Rate Monitoring

Since petroleum products are procured in United States Dollar, exchange rate is one of the input in computation of petroleum cap prices for the local market which are set in Tanzanian Shillings. EWURA sources from the Bank of Tanzania the data of exchange rates obtained by OMCs from purchases of US Dollar from commercial banks for payment of imported petroleum products. In January 2019, the exchange rate averaged at TShs 2,334 per USD before depreciating to TShs 2,437 per USD in March 2019. Following the closure of bureau de change throughout the country by the end of February 2019 with commercial banks being the only place for exchanging foreign currencies, the Tanzania Shilling stabilised with the exchange rate from July to December 2019 being almost the same as that of the same period in the year 2018. The average exchange rate in the year under review stood at TShs 2,322 per USD which is an increase of 1.7% compared to TShs 2,283 per USD recorded in year 2018. **Table 16** and **Figure 12** highlight the exchange rates for year 2018 and 2019.




Figure 13: Monthly Exchange Rate Trend in 2018 and 2019

5.3.2 Demurrage Costs Monitoring and Control

The Shipping and Supply Contract for petroleum products specifies the delivery date range (laycan) for a vessel delivering petroleum products into the country, the number of days allowed for offloading products based on the port facility being used and the demurrage rate for each day that a vessel is delayed to depart from the port after the allowed days for offloading petroleum products. It is therefore important to ensure there is efficiency in planning for vessel line up at the port and in offloading petroleum products that have been delivered by the supplier. The Authority continued to monitor demurrage costs to ensure they are at a minimal level. As a result, the average demurrage days dropped from 13.66 days in 2018 to 4.21 days in 2019. Likewise, the average demurrage costs dropped from 5.41 USD/MT in 2018 to 1.67 USD/MT. **Table 17** shows the trend of demurrage costs and demurrage days for the three ports.




Figure 14: Relationship between FOB prices and Local prices for Petrol in 2019




Figure 15: Relationship between FOB prices and Local prices for Diesel in 2019




Figure 16: Relationship between FOB prices and Local prices for Kerosene in 2019

6. COMPETITION MONITORING

In line with Section 31(1) of the Petroleum Act, Cap 392 the Authority discharges its functions transparently and objectively in order to promote fair competition in the sub-sector. It is the Authority's role to ensure that, there is fair competition among the operators, and that, the interests of all parties in the market including the public, business entities and the Government are balanced.

The Authority continued to monitor competition among players. Operators are allowed to stretch their business operations to whatever levels in their capacities provided that they do not breach the rules and licence terms and conditions. Operators are free to enter or exit the market, merge, acquire, re-brand or conduct business promotions provided that all is carried out in accordance with the legal provisions. In this respect, the determinants of fair competition are a number of operators in the market, new entries and exits from the market, operators' performances in regards of their market shares, and the number of anti-competitive practices reported. Anti-competitive practices constitute illegal actions including distortion of fuel quality standards, selling petroleum products beyond cap prices and breaching HSE practices.

6.1 Market Shares of Oil Marketing Companies (OMCs)

The petroleum market in the country remained competitive and fairly distributed among different OMCs. Four OMCs namely Puma, Oryx, TOTAL and GBP made up 48.2% of the total market share. Factors that attributed to the companies making up almost half of the market share include brand loyalty, strong distribution networks and supply contracts with large customers such as mining companies, power plants and airlines. **Table 18** presents the sales figures and market share of each OMC.

6.2 Market Shares of LPG Marketing Companies

In the year under review, the market leader in the LPG market was Oryx Gas with a market share of 47% followed by Taifa Gas (formerly Mihan Gas) with a market share of 19% and Manjis Gas with a market share of 12%. **Table 19** presents the market share of LPG companies.

The consumption of LPG in the country has been categorised based on LPG market and distribution zones. The Coastal zone that comprises of Dar es Salaam, Coast, Morogoro and Tanga regions was the leader with average LPG consumption of 54% of the total consumption. The Northern and Lake zones consumed 22% and 11%, respectively, while the remaining 13% was consumed in the Central, Western, Southern and Southern Highland Zones.

The Authority in collaboration with other key stakeholders continued to promote the use of LPG as an alternative source of energy.

7. LICENSING ACTIVITIES

Pursuant to Section 30(2) of the Petroleum Act, Cap 392, one of the functions conferred upon EWURA is to issue, renew, suspend or cancel construction approvals and operational licences. Section 131(1) of the Act stipulates that, any person who intends to undertake a regulated activity shall apply to EWURA for a licence. All these requirements aim to ensure that, developers and operators in the sub-sector construct facilities and operate in a manner that is compliant to the applicable laws, standards and the best petroleum industry practices. The Authority has also put in place an online application system namely, Licensing and Order Information System (LOIS) to ease licence applications. This system can be accessed via EWURA website www.ewura.go.tz or <https://lois.ewura.go.tz/ewura/home>.

During the year 2019, the Authority granted 462 licences compared to 535 licences issued in year 2018 whereby, 98% of these licences were granted within thirty (30) working days from the date a complete application was received as per EWURA Client Service Charter. Nevertheless, Section 133(1) of the Petroleum Act, Cap. 392 requires EWURA to issue licences within sixty (60) days from the date of receiving an application and upon satisfaction that all requirements for a licence have been complied with.

In addition, the Authority continued to ensure all operators undertaking petroleum activities in the country operate with valid licenses.

As of 31st December 2019, the Authority recorded 1,825 licensed entities out of 1,855 total entities equivalent to 98%. Applications of the remaining 30 entities were at different stages of review. During the period, some petrol stations providing services in rural areas were found to be non-compliant to some licensing requirements. In order to ensure continued supply of petroleum products in rural areas, petrol stations that didn't meet licensing requirements were issued with conditional licences requiring certain conditions be fulfilled within a specified timeframe provided that the conditions to be fulfilled were not related to HSE requirements.

A summary of licences issued in year 2019 and a list of applicants that were granted licences are shown in **Table 20** and **Appendix 10**. The Authority will continue to ensure that all entities operate with valid licences.

8. COMPLIANCE MONITORING AND ENFORCEMENT

In the year 2019, the Authority continued to undertake compliance monitoring and enforcement inspections. The objective of these inspections is to ensure that operators in the sub-sector comply with the applicable laws, rules, standards and the Best Petroleum Industry Practices along the petroleum supply chain. Compliance monitoring and enforcement demonstrates the consequences of non-compliance and provides deterrence to prevent future offences. Sections 8.1 to 8.8 present the monitoring programs and enforcement taken by the Authority in the year under review.

8.1 Monitoring Compliance to Petroleum Infrastructure Standards

The Authority continued to intensify regular and ad hoc compliance monitoring of petroleum facilities to check compliance with the standards, licence terms and conditions, applicable laws, HSE requirements and the Best Petroleum Industry Practices. The Authority conducted compliance monitoring to the following facilities: petrol stations, depots, consumer installations, LPG storage and filling plants, LPG super dealers' warehouses and consumer installations.

A total of 531 facilities were monitored in the period under review, out of which 41 were not operating. Non-operating facilities were either abandoned, under construction or were being renovated. Amongst the operating facilities 372 complied with licence terms and conditions, applicable laws, HSE requirements and the Best Petroleum Industry Practices whereas 118 facilities were non-compliant. This implies that, the compliance level in year 2019 is 76% which is slightly lower than the compliance level of 78% attained in year 2018. The Authority will continue to implement awareness programmes to the operators and the public in general as well as undertake regular compliance monitoring and enforcement so as to ensure that the facilities attain 100% level of compliance.

8.2 Monitoring Compliance to Petroleum Products Quality

One of the functions mandated to EWURA is to monitor petroleum quality and standards. This is in accordance with Section 30(2)(b) of the Petroleum Act, Cap 392. Section 179(1) of the same Act stipulates that, a person shall not distribute petroleum products unless such petroleum products conform to quality, safety and environmental specifications set out in the regulations made by the Minister.

During the period under review, the Authority continued to monitor compliance of petroleum products quality standards in various facilities. The Authority collected 290 samples from petrol stations, storage depots, condensate operators and drums seized by the police force. These samples were analysed at the laboratory to check their conformity with TBS specifications. Out of the collected samples 30 samples, equivalent to 10.34% did not conform to TBS specifications. In comparison, in year 2018 the Authority collected 481 samples, out of which 28 samples, equivalent to 5.82%, failed.

During the compliance monitoring exercise, two samples of diesel collected from Tarakea Petrol Station located in Rombo had very low flash points (10°C and 12°C) and very high sulphur content (above 1000ppm). Further investigation revealed that, the product was sourced from Shine Waste Recycling Plant located at Kongowe, Kibaha in Coast region.

The level of compliance with petroleum products quality specifications in year 2019 is 89.3% and low compared to 94.2% compliance level that was attained in year 2018. This is due to failure of samples that were contained in drums and seized by the Police among others and the fact that, in year 2019 the Authority mostly responded to collection of samples from facilities after receipt of complaints from consumers. Punitive measures were taken against the operators who were found with non-conforming petroleum products including closure of the facilities, payment of requisite fines, correction of the non-conforming products and disposal of the non-conforming products safely. The Authority will strive to ensure that the level of compliance is at 100%. **Figure 17** presents a trend of petroleum products quality results from year 2011 to year 2019.

8.3 Monitoring Compliance with Fuel Marking Programs

Fuel marking program was introduced in Tanzania Mainland in September 2010 for the purpose of eliminating adulteration of petroleum products and curbing dumping transit, tax exempted and smuggled petroleum products in the local market. During the period under review, M/S SICPA SA in Association with Global Fluids International (T) Ltd continued to mark kerosene, diesel and petrol products intended for the local market except tax exempted products and Jet A1. The program is done pursuant to the Petroleum Products (Marking and Quality Control) Rules, GN. No. 210.

In 2019, the Authority continued to oversee the program and ensure that it is implemented in accordance with the Rules. The total marked volume of petroleum products was 3,248,775,106 litres in 2019 compared to 3,025,177,645 litres in 2018, equivalent to 7% increase. The increase in the marked volume of petroleum products is directly related to the growth in demand of petroleum products which is a result of growth in economic activities. The marked volume of petrol in 2019 increased to 1,332,150,663 litres compared to 1,216,380,493 litres in 2018, equivalent to 10% increase. On the other hand, the volume of diesel marked in 2019 increased to 1,876,924,378 litres compared to 1,761,797,175 litres in 2018, equivalent to 7% increase.




Figure 18: Trend of Kerosene Marked Volumes from 2011 to 2019 (in millions)

In the same period, total marked volumes of kerosene declined from 46,999,977 litres in year 2018 to 39,700,065 litres in year 2019, equivalent to 16% decrease. The decrease of the marked volume for kerosene is attributed to fall in demand of the said product in rural areas as rural areas as more villages are now connected with electricity coupled with an increased use of LPG and solar energy for cooking and lighting. Another factor that contributed to the decline of kerosene marked volume is stern measures taken to curb fuel adulteration. **Table 21** presents a trend of marked volumes in year 2018 and 2019 whereas **Figure 18** shows a trend of marked kerosene volumes from year 2011 to year 2018.


8.4 Monitoring Compliance with Fuel Marker Concentration Levels

During the period under review, the Authority continued to monitor marker concentration levels in three major petroleum products namely, diesel, petrol and kerosene which are marked under the fuel marker program. To achieve this, the Authority conducted periodic and ad-hoc inspections and collected samples from various petroleum facilities across the country for the purpose of conducting marker detection. Samples were collected and tested in accordance with the Petroleum Product (Marking and Quality Control) Rules, 2010, GN. No. 210.

In the year under review, the Authority collected and tested samples from 718 petroleum facilities, out of which 23 facilities, equivalent to 3.20% failed the fuel marker detection test. In comparison, in year 2018 the Authority collected and tested samples from 598 petroleum facilities, out of which 35 facilities, equivalent to 5.85% failed the fuel marker detection test. The level of compliance has increased in the year under review compared to the previous year. The Authority is striving to ensure that 100% level of compliance is attained at all times.

Punitive measures were taken against the operators found with non-conforming petroleum products pursuant to the Petroleum Product (Marking and Quality Control) Rules, 2010 including closure of the facilities and payment of the requisite fines. Some of the operators who were found to have dumped transit products were referred to TRA for checking tax compliance and any payment thereof before reopening the facilities. Tarakea Petrol Station who was found to have non-conforming diesel was required to safely dispose the product.

8.5 Monitoring Compliance with the Price Setting Rules

The Authority continued to inspect and monitor compliance of operators to the Energy and Water Utilities Regulatory Authority (Petroleum Products Price Setting) (Amendments) Rules, 2018 GN. No. 163 and the Energy and Water Utilities Regulatory Authority (Petroleum Products Price Setting) (Amendments) Rules, 2018 GN. No. 269. Petroleum products cap prices are issued to the public on the first Wednesday of every month. A total of 836 petroleum facilities were inspected compared to 1,148 facilities that were inspected in year 2018. During the period under review, all facilities

sold petroleum products at or below the issued cap prices hence compliance was at 100%. This is an improvement compared to the 99.91% compliance level attained in the previous year implying that compliance level has increased. The Authority will continue to monitor compliance to applicable cap prices and ensure that 100% compliance level is maintained at all times.

8.6 Monitoring Facilities Constructed Without Construction Approvals

Pursuant to Section 126(1) of the Petroleum Act, Cap 392, any person intending to construct a petroleum installation or petroleum carriage facility has to apply in writing to EWURA for a construction approval. On the other hand, Section 127(1) of the Petroleum Act, Cap 392 prohibits construction of petroleum installations without an approval from EWURA whereas Section 127(2) of the Petroleum Act, Cap 392, provides that any person who contravenes the foregoing commits an offence and upon conviction shall be liable to a fine of not less than twenty million shillings or to imprisonment for a term of not less than three years or both.

During the period under review, the Authority continued to receive and evaluate applications from project developers who intended to construct new petroleum facilities. A total of 139 construction approvals were granted by EWURA in 2019 compare to 124 construction approvals granted in year 2018.

In the year 2019, the Authority also conducted compliance monitoring programs in Tanzania Mainland to various petroleum facilities which were under construction. A total of 56 new facilities were found to be constructed without approval from the Authority compared to 37 facilities in year 2018. Most of these facilities were petrol stations and LPG storage filling plants. Punitive measures were taken against the defaulters in accordance with Section 127(2) of the Petroleum Act, Cap 392 and Rule 4(3) of the Petroleum (Wholesale, Storage, Retail and Consumer Installations) Rules, 2018. The Authority will continue to conduct awareness and enforce the rules to ensure compliance. **Appendix 11** presents a list of petroleum installations that were constructed without construction approvals in the period under review.

8.7 Monitoring Compliance to HSE in Petroleum Operations and Transportation

Pursuant to Sections 30(1)(i) and 30(1)(k) of the Petroleum Act, Cap 392, the Authority is mandated to monitor environmental and safety impacts in the petroleum services and promote health and safety in the working environment of persons employed in the petroleum industry respectively. Moreover, Section 179 (1) of the same Act, requires that, a person shall not distribute petroleum products unless such petroleum products conform to quality, safety and environmental specifications set out in the regulations made by the Minister.

In order to ensure that these functions are accomplished, in year 2019, the Authority continued to conduct regular and ad hoc inspections across the country with the aim of ensuring that petroleum operations are conducted in a manner that does not jeopardize HSE requirements.

Between January and December 2019, four (4) incidents detrimental to HSE were found at different facilities as summarized in **Table 22**.

8.8 Joint Inspections with other Government Institutions

During the period under review, the Authority continued to participate in joint inspections with various Government institutions. Joint inspections aim at supporting effective risk management and give preference to shared systems across several institutions. Details of the inspections are presented hereunder.

8.8.1 Fuel Marker Level Concentration and Petroleum Quality Monitoring

EWURA in collaboration with TRA and the Police Force conducted fuel marker detection test and quality check to petroleum products that were stored in drums at residential premises at Mbezi Beach area, Kinondoni district in Dar es Salaam. Storage of petroleum products in drums and at residential premises contravened Section 179 of the Petroleum Act, Cap 392. Laboratory test results indicate that, the intercepted product was diesel and was not marked (i.e it had zero (0 ppm) concentration and it was either obtained through illegal means including smuggling via Indian Ocean or stolen from the petroleum infrastructure at the Dar es Salaam port. Figure 25 indicates drums with petroleum products stored at residential premises.

Furthermore, a team composed of officials from EWURA, TRA, TPA and President's Office conducted a joint marker surveillance exercise at petrol stations in Arusha, Lindi, Mtwara, Tanga and Kilimanjaro regions with the objective of cracking down operators who were selling or offering for sale petroleum products that do no conform to the Petroleum (Marking and Quality Control) Rules, GN. No. 210.

8.8.2 Supervision of Hydrostatic Test at Buseresere Filling Station

Following allegations from the residents nearby Buseresere Filling Station that their water wells were contaminated with petroleum products, the Authority in collaboration with other Government Institutions carried a joint inspection to verify the claims. The participated Government officials were from NEMC, Chato Village Council, Chato District Council and Geita Regional Commissioner's Office. This was done in the presence of the Petrol Station operator and complainant representatives. In this joint exercise, EWURA supervised the hydrostatic test of the the petrol station's underground storage tanks and connecting pipelines.

8.8.3 East African Crude Oil Pipeline (EACOP) Project

During the period under review, EWURA continued to participate in the ongoing discussions of Host Government Agreement (HGA) for the East African Crude Oil Pipeline (EACOP). Also EWURA and Petroleum Authority of Uganda (PAU) continued to collaborate in order to facilitate smooth implementation of EACOP project. Draft MoU between EWURA and PAU was developed and await to be signed by the two Parties.

EWURA is mandated by the Petroleum Act 2015 and Petroleum (Local Content) Regulations 2017 to monitor local content compliance of midstream and downstream petroleum activities. Local content is among critical issues in the EACOP project implementation. The project is expected to be implemented in three phases namely- early project activities phase; construction phase; and operation phase. Currently the project is in the first phase of early project activities which mainly entail preparations for the subsequent phases of construction and operation. The current phase of project activities includes carrying out various studies such as Front End Engineering Design, geotechnical surveys, geophysical surveys, hydrological surveys, land acquisition, environmental studies, among others. The highest potential of local content is expected to be realized during the construction phase where the volume of activities would be at its maximum.

9. GEOGRAPHICAL INFORMATION SYSTEM (GIS) MAPPING

In year 2019, the Authority commenced GIS mapping of petrol stations aiming at establishing exact locations (coordinates) for each petroleum facility, understanding the spartial distribution for ease monitoring, planning and public reference. A total of 54 petroleum retail outlets were mapped at Kinondoni District in Dar es Salaam. The Authority is continuing with GIS Mapping exercise throughout the country.

10. ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT ASSESSMENT AND AUDIT REVIEW

Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) is a tool for decision-makers, regulatory bodies and the public used to predict, evaluate and analyse environmental impacts before a project commences with the primary purpose of preventing environmental degradation. It evaluates the project's potential environmental impacts and social risks in its area of influence and incorporates monitoring plans. On the other hand, Environmental Audit (EA) looks at environmental performance for an existing operation or activity and are specifically designed to check and evaluate the effectiveness of environmental management systems. In light of the foregoing, the Environmental Management Act, 2004 requires project proponents and operators to conduct Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) studies before commencement of project and Environmental Audits after operation respectively.

Between January and December 2019, the Authority reviewed 51 Environmental Impact Assessment and Environmental Audit studies from project proponents and operators respectively. The Authority enunciated its concerns and views regarding the studies. All the submitted studies which are related to petroleum downstream sub sector were prepared by individual environmental experts or firms on behalf of project proponents and operators. In the previous year 80 EIA and EA studies were reviewed.

11. INCIDENT INVESTIGATIONS

Section 30(2)(o) of the Petroleum Act, Cap 392 mandates the Authority to investigate incidents that result into damage of infrastructure, injury or loss of life or property and recommend corrective actions so as to avoid recurrence of similar incidents in the future. The Authority continued to investigate incidents in the petroleum sub-sector as per mentioned legal requirement.

In 2019, the Authority investigated a total of 4 incidents, which are: public water wells contaminated with fuel, overturning of two road fuel tankers and robbery incident at one petrol station. The Authority identified the cause of the incidents, impacts emanating from these incidents and recommended corrective actions for each incident. Overall incidents that were investigated are indicated in **Appendix 12**.

Of recent there have been recurrence of road tanker incidents resulting to fatality and injuries. In the year under review, EWURA was involved in the investigations of two major road tanker incidents as explained below:

a) Msamvu Itigi, Morogoro

On 10th August 2019, an incident involving a road tanker with registration No. T717 DDF/T645 CAN, property of C.F. Investment Company Limited occurred at Msamvu Itigi area in Morogoro region. The tanker carrying petroleum products overturned resulting to oil spillage and fire explosion. This explosion caused fatalities, injuries and property damages.

b) Hanga Ngadinda Village, Madaba District in Ruvuma Region

On 11th August 2019, a road fuel tanker T243 BCU / T685 DCV carrying petroleum products, owned by Njombe Filling Station Company Limited was involved in an accident at Hanga Ngadinda village, Madaba district in Ruvuma region. The road tanker crushed into trees and caught fire which was later put off. In this incident the truck cabin and tires were severely burnt. Fortunately there was no fatality but the driver sustained severe injuries.

The Authority in collaboration with Land Transport Regulatory Authority (LATRA), which is responsible for regulating land transport, will continue to strengthen efforts and conduct public awareness so that there is no recurrence of similar road incidents.

12. KEY ACHIEVEMENTS AND CHALLENGES

In the year under review, the Authority recorded good performance in mid and downstream petroleum sub-sector by devoting itself in fulfilling its responsibilities. While carrying out its mandate, the Authority also faced a number of challenges. The achievements and challenges that arose in year 2019 are presented below:

12.1 Key Achievements

The following are key achievements that were recorded by the Authority:

- (a) Security of supply of petroleum products in the country was maintained throughout the year as per Petroleum (General) Regulation, 2011, which require the minimum stock of petroleum products in the country to be able to serve for a minimum of fifteen (15) days in case of interrupted importation;
- (b) Monthly publication of cap prices for petroleum products for domestic supply which reflected World Market prices of refined petroleum products (diesel, petrol and kerosene);
- (c) Increased investment in the petroleum products supply chain especially in petroleum bulk storage facilities, LPG facilities and retail networks;
- (d) Issuance of conditional licenses to applicants of village petrol stations in order to facilitate the supply of petroleum products in rural areas;

- (e) Improved efficiency of bulk procurement system for petroleum products through continued oversight done by the Authority;
- (f) The newly introduced petroleum receiving ports of Mtwara and Tanga continued to operate efficiently;
- (g) Maintained high quality of petroleum products sold or offered for sale in the domestic supply chain;
- (h) Decreased level of dumping and tax evasion of transit petroleum products in the country due to the regular fuel marker detection exercises conducted by the Authority. This also contributed to an increase Government tax revenues; and
- (i) Increased participation of Tanzanians in petroleum downstream activities through ownership and operations of retail outlets.

12.2 Key Challenges

Apart from the above achievements, during the period under review, the Authority experience a number of challenges including:

- (a) Lack of petrol stations in rural areas: Capital investment required for construction of retail outlets is higher while the demand of petroleum products in rural area is low, hence low return on investment. This discourages investors from investing in these areas. The Authority in collaboration with other Government institutions, will prepare a plan to facilitate investments of petrol stations in rural areas;
- (b) Lack of knowledge and public awareness related to HSE on petroleum products: It has been observed that, some members of the community rush to collect petroleum products from fuel road tankers involved in accidents, others sell petroleum products in plastic bottles and drums while others store petroleum products in residential houses. These malpractices may result into fatal accidents, health problems and environmental damage. The Authority will continue to conduct public awareness on HSE related issues; and
- (c) Lack of knowledge and expertise in petroleum industry: This challenge attributes to many petrol station operators, LPG and Lubricant distributors, not to comply with regulatory requirements. The Authority will continue to provide awareness and education to petroleum operators through organised workshops, fliers and public seminars.

13. CONCLUSION

The mid and downstream petroleum industry is generally performing well in all regions of Tanzania. Consumption of petroleum in the country has increased which can be associated with the economic growth of the country. The whole supply chain is operated in accordance to HSE standards and industry best international practices. EWURA will continue to work hard to maintain sustainable availability of high quality and reliable petroleum products at cost reflective prices to play vital role in economic growth of the country.
