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CHAIRMAN'S STATEMENT

On behalf of the EWURA Board of Directors, I am delighted to present the eighth Mid and Downstream Petroleum Subsector Performance Report for the year 2021. The report provides information on relevant matters in the sub-sector, including legal instruments governing the subsector, available infrastructure, licensed operators and importation and distribution of petroleum products in the country.

This report identifies potential areas of investment to ensure sufficient supply of petroleum products throughout the country. As a regulatory body, EWURA continued to oversee all matters related to importation of petroleum products to ensure there is security of supply; and conducted monitoring activities to ensure that petroleum facilities meet the required standards and products that are distributed meet the set quality standards. EWURA also developed and oversaw implementation of regulatory tools and guidelines that facilitate distribution of petroleum products in a manner that is compliant to health, safety and environmental standards. This includes regulatory tools that promote construction of petrol stations in rural areas and safe distribution of LPG so as to reduce the use of traditional energy sources that have a negative impact on human health and the environment.

It is worth noting that in the period under review, the subsector recorded significant achievements in various areas, such as continued stability of the security of supply of petroleum products in the country; improved petroleum infrastructure and petroleum products quality; petroleum products pump prices being kept in line with the trend of world market prices; and an increase in the number of petrol stations in rural areas that ensured sustainable supply of petroleum products in those areas.

I would like to extend my gratitude to the Ministry of Energy, the Ministry of Water and all stakeholders in the mid and downstream petroleum subsector for their continued support and co-operation.

Finally, I take this opportunity to congratulate my colleagues, the EWURA Board members, Management and Staff for their commitment, dedication and insightful contributions aimed at developing this very important subsector.

FOREWORD

EWURA is mandated to regulate the mid and downstream petroleum subsector in mainland Tanzania pursuant to the Petroleum Act, Cap 392 together with the Energy and Water Utilities Regulatory Authority (EWURA) Act, Cap 414. The Authority accomplishes its regulatory roles by undertaking technical, economic and safety regulatory functions.

This report provides information and data regarding the performance of the mid and downstream petroleum subsector in mainland Tanzania. Importation of petroleum products for local consumption increased by 11% from 3.56 billion litres in the year 2020 to 3.96 billion litres in 2021, while petroleum imports for transit to neighbouring countries increased by 40% from 2.22 billion litres in year 2020 to 3.11 billion litres in 2021. In total, imports of petroleum products in 2021 amounted to 7.07 billion litres, which is an increase of 22% from 5.78 billion litres imported in 2020. The rise in petroleum imports is attributed to increased economic activities in 2021 after a slowdown in 2020 particularly in neighbouring countries that imposed lockdowns for some months due to the outbreak of the coronavirus pandemic.

LPG importation also continued to grow, with imports reaching 248,216 metric tonnes (MT) in the year 2021, which is a 28% increase from 194,597 MT imported in 2020. The Government and LPG marketing companies will continue to build awareness to the public on the importance and advantages of using LPG as a cleaner energy source. The lubricants market also grew by 7% with total imports and blended quantities reaching 55.52 million litres, having increased from 51.77 million litres that were imported and blended in 2020.

In the year under review, global crude oil prices increased by 63% to an average price of 70.76 USD/BBL compared to an average price of 43.34 USD/BBL recorded in the year 2020. Consequently, the FOB prices of refined products and local pump prices also increased. The increase in crude oil prices was due to low supply of petroleum products while demand for the products increased after most countries eased or ended lockdowns following availability of COVID-19 vaccinations.

EWURA has continued to regulate the mid and downstream petroleum subsector by ensuring the subsector is streamlined. EWURA ensured there is security of supply throughout the year and continued to undertake inspections to ensure petroleum operations are conducted in compliance to the applicable laws, standards and best petroleum industry practices.

I hope that this report will provide useful information to guide investors on areas of opportunities for investment so that petroleum products are made available throughout the country in a manner that is most efficient and effective while adhering to health, safety and environmental concerns.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Section 30(1) of the Petroleum Act, Cap 392 mandates EWURA to perform technical, economical and safety regulatory functions in respect to mid and downstream petroleum activities in mainland Tanzania. In discharging its functions, EWURA is required to regulate the subsector in an effective, efficient and transparent manner. In that regard, EWURA prepares annual performance reports which provide data and information on the petroleum subsector for public consumption.

This is the eighth Mid and Downstream Petroleum Subsector Performance Report highlighting key information regarding the subsector. The report includes the regulatory tools governing the subsector, applicable standards and the performance of the subsector in the year 2021.

Infrastructure


Key petroleum infrastructures in the mid and downstream subsector are: berthing facilities at Dar es Salaam, Tanga and Mtwara ports, petroleum products receiving and storage terminals and distribution facilities.

Tanzania mainland has 23 operational petroleum receiving terminals located around Dar es Salaam, Tanga and Mtwara ports with a total storage capacity of 1,409,244 cubic metres. There are six Liquefied Petroleum Gas (LPG) storage facilities with a total storage capacity of 15,750 MT. By the end of 2021, there were 1,997 operating petrol stations whereby 279 are located in rural areas.

Bulk Procurement System (BPS)

Bulk Procurement System (BPS) continued to be the means of procuring the main liquid petroleum products which are petrol, diesel, kerosene and Jet A-1 with products being imported through Dar es Salaam, Tanga and Mtwara ports. During the period under review, the Petroleum Bulk Procurement Agency (PBPA) awarded 107 BPS contracts to suppliers that won BPS tenders for supply of petroleum products to Tanzania.




The weighted average of the premium tendered by suppliers that won the BPS tenders in year 2021 were 28 USD/MT for diesel, 30 USD/MT for petrol and 43 USD/MT for Jet A1/Kerosene. The weighted average premium for diesel, petrol and Jet A-1/ kerosene in the year 2021 decreased by 20%, 9% and 25% respectively compared the weighted average premiums of the products in 2020.


Importation of Petroleum Products

Importation of liquid petroleum products increased by 22% from 6.15 billion litres imported in 2020 to 7.07 billion litres imported in 2021. Local imports increased by 11% while transit imports increased by 40%. The increase is mainly attributed to increased economic activities, particularly in neighbouring countries that ended lockdowns implemented in 2020 due to the coronavirus outbreak.

LPG importation increased by 28% from 194,597 MT imported in 2020 to 248,216 MT imported in 2021 due to efforts done by the Government and LPG marketing companies (LMCs) to create awareness to the public on the importance of using LPG as a cleaner alternative to traditional fuels such as charcoal, firewood and kerosene coupled with market promotions done by LMCs.





In the year under review, the quantity of lubricants supplied into the market was 55.52 million litres which is a 7% increase from 51.77 million litres supplied in 2020. Out of the quantity that was supplied in 2021, 85% was from locally blended products and the remaining quantity was from imports.




Petroleum Prices

The average crude oil price in 2021 was 70.76 USD/BBL which is an increase of 63% compared to the average crude oil price of 43.34 USD/BBL in the year 2020. The increase in global crude oil prices was due to low supply of petroleum products while demand increased after the ease or end of lockdowns which were implemented in many countries in 2020 to curb the outbreak of coronavirus pandemic.



The increase in crude oil prices also subsequently led to the increase in prices of refined products. In the year under review, the FOB prices of petrol, diesel and kerosene/Jet A-1 increased by 58%, 43% and 49% respectively compared to the average FOB prices recorded in 2020.



Compliance Monitoring of Petroleum Facilities

During the period under review, EWURA inspected 809 petroleum facilities in mainland Tanzania to check compliance to applicable laws, licence terms and conditions, standards and best petroleum industry practices. Out of the inspected petroleum facilities, 495 facilities, equivalent to 61%, complied with all requirements at the time of inspection, which is a decline from the compliance level of 71% attained in 2020. The Authority took legal action against operators whose facilities were found to be non-compliant, including closure of the facilities until the respective operators rectified the observed anomalies. The Authority will continue to conduct regular compliance monitoring and enforcement in order to ensure all petroleum facilities comply with the applicable laws, standards and best petroleum industry practices.

Monitoring of the Quality of Petroleum Products Distributed in the market

During the period under review, EWURA collected 942 samples from petroleum facilities in order to check conformity to quality standards. Out of the collected samples, 58 samples, equivalent to 6.16%, did not conform to standards. This is an improvement from the non-compliance level of 12.19% attained in 2020. Legal action was taken against operators that were found with non-conforming products.

Investigations into Illegal Petroleum Operations

During the period under review, eight (8) operators were found to be undertaking petroleum activities in a manner that is detrimental to HSE requirements. Out of those operators, five (5) were found conducting illegal re-filling of LPG cylinders while three (3) were found storing LPG cylinders in confined stores. Legal action was taken against the persons found undertaking illegal operations.

Challenges in the Petroleum Mid and Downstream Subsector

The main challenges that still face the subsector are: lack of a Single Receiving Terminal (SRT) for white petroleum products so as to ensure products are received within a short period of time and hence reduce demurrage costs; limited capacity of LPG offloading facility at the ports; inadequate investments in petrol stations in rural areas; smuggling of petroleum products from neighbouring countries; high starter pack cost which limits the increase of users of LPG, especially low income earners; and continued illegal re-filling of LPG cylinders.



1. INTRODUCTION

The Mid and Downstream Petroleum Subsector Performance Report is published by the Energy and Water Utilities Regulatory Authority (EWURA) on an annual basis. In the series, this is the eighth edition since the first report was published in 2014. The report provides data and information regarding the regulatory tools used in regulating the subsector, available petroleum infrastructure, petroleum products importation, movement of petroleum products and prices in the world and local market, performance of the fuel marking program and operators' compliance to various legislation, including supply of products that meet national quality standards as provided by the Tanzania Bureau of Standards (TBS).

1. Regulatory Instruments and Standards

The mid and downstream petroleum subsector is regulated using various legal instruments and standards. These instruments include: The National Energy Policy 2015, the Petroleum Act 2015 Cap 392, EWURA Act, Cap 414 and other cross-cutting regulatory instruments.

1.1.2 Petroleum Products and Infrastructure Standards

Pursuant to section 30(2) (b) of the Petroleum Act, Cap. 392, EWURA is mandated to monitor the quality and standards of petroleum products. In performing its regulatory activities, the Authority ensures that petroleum products and infrastructure comply with standards, whereby the Tanzania

Bureau of Standards (TBS) is the statutory body in mainland Tanzania whose main responsibility, among others, include formulation of standards. In developing Tanzanian standards related to petroleum products and facilities, TBS involves key stakeholders, including EWURA. International standards are used in the absence of national standards. 2. LIQUID PETROLEUM PRODUCTS INFRASTRUCTURE

The available infrastructure in the Mid and Downstream petroleum subsector include offloading facilities, petroleum receiving and storage terminals, petroleum retail outlets (petrol stations), LPG storage and re-filling facilities and lubricant blending plants.

2.1 Offloading/Receiving Facilities

All liquid petroleum products are imported using marine tankers which are received through berthing facilities located at Dar es Salaam, Tanga and Mtwara ports. The ports are also used to receive petroleum products destined to neighbouring landlocked countries of Zambia, Uganda, DRC, Malawi, Rwanda, and Burundi with most of the imports being received through Dar es Salaam port.

Mtwara port is designated to receive petroleum products mainly to serve the demand for Mtwara, Lindi and Ruvuma regions whereas Tanga port is designated to receive petroleum products mainly to serve the demand of the other regions of Tanga, Kilimanjaro, Manyara and Arusha. Nonetheless, products received through the two ports can be distributed to other regions and transited to neighbouring countries. **Table 1** indicates the maximum safe operating capacity and products received at the berthing facilities at each port.

2.2 Petroleum Storage Terminals

2.2.1 Receiving terminals

Tanzania mainland has 23 operational petroleum receiving terminals located around Dar es Salaam, Tanga and Mtwara ports with a total storage capacity of 1,409,244 cubic metres. Amongst all facilities, TIPER has the largest storage capacity which is equivalent to 18% of the total capacity. These terminals receive petroleum products directly from berthing facilities and can store products to meet the country's demand for about 122 days at the current consumption rate of 4,131,560,960 cubic metres per annum. **Appendix 1** presents the storage capacities of each receiving terminal.

2.2.2 Inland storage depot

There are 29 upcountry inland storage depots with a total storage capacity of 75,625 cubic metres. These depots can receive products from terminals by means of railway wagons and trucks. However, as most of the petroleum products are transported by road tankers, use of these depots was considered to be cost inefficient mainly due to double handling costs. As a result, most of these depots are non-operational. Road tankers are now used to transport petroleum products directly from receiving terminals at the ports to petroleum retail outlets and consumer installations. Following revival of the railway route from Tanga to Isaka, Kigoma and Mwanza, some of the inland storage depots have been rehabilitated and have started operations. The capacities of inland storage depots are presented in **Appendix 2**.

2.3 TAZAMA Receiving Terminal

TAZAMA Pipelines Limited receives spiked crude oil through SBM and stores the product at its receiving terminal located at Kigamboni Municipality in Dar es Salaam with a total storage capacity of 231,000 cubic metres. The crude oil received at the terminal is transported by a pipeline to Indeni refinery located in Zambia.

2.4 Transportation Infrastructure

Distribution of petroleum products within Tanzania mainland from the receiving terminals at the ports is mainly done by road using road tankers. Road tankers are also used to transit petroleum products to landlocked neighbouring countries.

Despite the use of road tankers to transport most of the petroleum products, the Tanga to Isaka, Kigoma and Mwanza railway line has been revived and is used to transport petroleum products. The railway wagons are now used by GBP to transport products from the Tanga Terminal to storage depots in Kigoma and Mwanza.

TAZAMA Pipelines Limited, owns and operates a pipeline with a total length of 1,710 km and throughput capacity of 1,100 MT per annum. The pipeline transports spiked crude oil from Kigamboni, Dar es Salaam in Tanzania, to Indeni Refinery located at Ndola in Zambia.

2.5 Petrol Stations

As of 31st December 2021, there were 1,997 operational petrol stations in the country compared to 1,759 petrol stations in year 2020, equivalent to an increase of 13.5%. The continued increase in the number of petrol stations is attributed to the increased demand of petroleum products in the country due to growth in economic activities, good investment policy in the country, and an increase in road networks. Most of these petrol stations are located in urban areas despite the fact that there is increased demand of petroleum products in rural areas. By the end of 2021, there were 279 petrol station in rural areas which is a 42% increase from the stations that were available by the end of 2020.

The Government continues devising and implementing various measures to increase investments in petrol stations in rural areas. Among other measures, the Authority continued to issue conditional licences to rural petrol stations that meet minimum HSE requirements so that they

can continue to offer services while the respective operators rectify the other anomalies within a given timeframe. In addition, the Petroleum (Wholesale, Storage, Retail and Consumer Installation Operations) Rules also require retailers who own at least four petrol stations in a city, municipality or district township to construct at least one petrol station in a township or village that has no station. **Table 2** presents the number of licensed petrol stations in each region.

82 rural petrol stations were licensed in 2021 making a total of 279 licensed petrol stations in rural areas by the end of 2021, increasing from 197 petrol stations in 2020.

3. LIQUID PETROLEUM PRODUCTS SUPPLY AND CONSUMPTION

3.1. Importation of Petroleum Products through the Bulk Procurement System

Through coordination of PBPA, the country continued to import petrol, diesel, kerosene and Jet A-1 through the Bulk Procurement System (BPS). Other petroleum products, including LPG, HFO, lubricants, base oil, petcoke and bitumen are imported by companies licensed to conduct wholesale business through independent arrangements by each company.

A total of 107 BPS tenders were floated in 2021, which is an increase of 20 tenders compared to 87 BPS tenders floated in 2020. The increase in tenders is attributed to the increase in demand for petroleum products in the country and neighbouring countries. **Table 3** indicates a summary of suppliers who won BPS tenders and the number of tenders won during the year under review and **Appendix 3** presents a list of all BPS tenders, the winning bidders and the corresponding premiums.

As shown in **Figure 1**, the weighted average premiums in 2021 decreased by 20%, 9% and 25% for diesel, petrol and Jet A-1/kerosene, respectively compared to the weighted average premiums in 2020 due to increased competition from bidders in BPS tenders.

Premiums for supply of petroleum products through Dar es Salaam port continued to be lower than premiums of products imported through Tanga and Mtwara ports mainly due to economies of scale that can be attained at the Dar es Salaam port. In the period under review, only 19 BPS tenders out of 107 BPS tenders were for Tanga and Mtwara. The average premiums for supply of petroleum products through the three ports is as shown in **Table 4**. The monthly premiums of each petroleum product for each port are as provided in **Appendix 4**.

3.2 Quantities of Imported Liquid Petroleum Products

The main imported petroleum products are petrol, diesel, kerosene, Jet A-1 and HFO. In 2021, a total of 7,070,146,001 litres were imported, which is a 22% increase compared to 5,776,857,217 litres imported in 2020. Imports for the local market accounts for 56% of the total imports and the remaining 44% were imports destined for transit to neighbouring countries as depicted in **Figure 2**.

Imports for local consumption increased by 11% while imports for transit increased by 41% when compared to the quantities imported in 2020 as shown in **Table 5**. The increase in imports is attributed mainly to increased economic activities after most of the neighbouring countries ended the lockdowns that were implemented in 2020 to curb the coronavirus outbreak, leading to increased demand for petroleum products. As shown in **Table 6**, imports of kerosene have continued to decline as consumers increasingly use LPG as an alternative source of fuel. Additional details of the imported quantities for each petroleum products for the local and transit markets are indicated in **Appendix 5**.

3.3 Consumption of Liquid Petroleum Products

In the year 2021, a total of 4,113,238,620 litres of liquid petroleum products were consumed, equivalent to a 13.4% increase when compared to 3,627,103,444 litres consumed in the year 2020 as depicted in **Table 7**.

The main business segments that consume petroleum products and stimulate the growth of the downstream petroleum subsector include transportation, industries, construction, mining and aviation. The quantities of petroleum products consumed by each business segment is as shown in **Table 8**. In the year under review, direct customers (industry & agriculture) consumed 48% of the total consumed petroleum products and the retail outlet segment (transportation) consumed 44%. As most areas get connected to the national grid, consumption of liquid fuel in power generation and heating has been negligible whereas only 0.15% of petroleum products were used for power generation in 2021.

3.3.1 Petrol Station Sales

In the period under review, the annual sales of petroleum products at petrol stations was 3,641,810,927 litres. Dar es Salaam has continued to have the highest average annual sales per petrol station, followed by Iringa, Arusha, Coast, Mwanza and Dodoma. **Table 9** shows the average sales of petrol stations per region.

3.3.2 Aviation Fuel Consumption and Distribution

Aviation fuels were mainly supplied by three Oil Marketing Companies (OMCs). These are Puma Energy Ltd, Total (T) Ltd and Oilcom (T) Ltd. A total of 164,376,685 litres of Jet A-1 and 414,560 litres of Aviation gasoline (AvGas) were distributed and consumed at various airports in Tanzania. Puma Energy continued to be the only supplier of AvGas.




Figure 3: Jet A-1 Consumption and Distribution by Airports and Companies (volume in 1,000 litres)

Julius Nyerere International Airport (JNIA) accounted for 84% of the total Jet A-1 consumption due to a higher number of traffic compared to other airports, followed by Kilimanjaro International Airport (KIA) that consumed 15%. The consumption of Jet A-1 by airports is as indicated in **Figure 3**.

3.4 Stock Availability

The petroleum products stock levels are monitored by EWURA in accordance with the Petroleum (General) Regulations of 2011. In order to ensure that the country has sufficient stocks at all times, all OMCs are required to maintain at least 15 days stocks based on their local market share. In that regard, EWURA monitors wholesalers' compliance to this requirement by checking the OMCs stock balances on a weekly basis and ensures sufficient products are procured through BPS on a monthly basis.




Figure 4: Average Stock Days for Petrol, Diesel and Jet A-1 in 2021




Figure 5: Average Stock Days for HFO and LPG in 2021

In the year under review, the country had sufficient stocks to meet the demand for more than 15 days with occasional stock levels that suffice the market for about 13 days as indicated in **Figure 4** and **Figure 5**. The low stock levels of petrol and diesel experienced in August 2021 was mainly due to an increase in demand during the month whereas the average daily consumption of petrol increased from an average of 3.9 million litres during the first half of 2021 to an average of 4.1 million litres in August 2021. Likewise, the average daily consumption of diesel increased from an average of 5.6 million litres during the first half of 2021 to 6.2 million litres in August 2021.

4. PRICES OF LIQUID PETROLEUM PRODUCTS

The prices of petroleum products in the mid and downstream subsector were determined and published in accordance with Section 166 of the Petroleum Act, Cap 392. Petroleum wholesale and retail cap prices for diesel, petrol and kerosene are set on a monthly basis as required by the Energy and Water Utilities Regulator Authority (Petroleum Products Price Setting) Rules.

4.1 Trend of World Prices for Petroleum Products

Most of the petroleum products supplied to Tanzania originate from the Arab Gulf, with some suppliers originating from Oman and India. The crude oil price which affects the Tanzanian market is thus the Brent crude oil price, while FOB prices are dependent on the price reference specified in supply and shipping contracts. Currently, prices of petrol are based on the Mediterranean (MED) market prices while prices of diesel, Jet A-1 and kerosene are based on the Arabian Gulf (AG) market prices as published by Platts.

4.1.1 World Market Crude Oil Prices




Figure 6: The Trend of Brent Crude Oil Prices in 2019, 2020 and 2021

In the year under review, the average price of crude oil stood at USD 70.76 per barrel compared to USD 43.34 per barrel in 2020, equivalent to an increase of 63%. Following an increase in availability and distribution of COVID-19 vaccinations during the year under review, most countries in the world eased or ended the lockdowns that were implemented since the outbreak of coronavirus in 2020. As a result of the global COVID-19 vaccination drive, economic activities rebounded, resulting in an increase in demand for petroleum products while production of the products did not increase proportionately, leading to a sharp rise in demand and hence high increase in crude oil prices. The trend of crude oil prices is as shown in **Figure 6**.

4.1.2 World Refined Petroleum Products Market Prices




Figure 7: Average World Market Refined Petroleum Products FOB Price Trends in 2020 and 2021

In the year under review, the average FOB prices for refined petroleum products in the world market recorded an increasing trend. The average prices for petrol, diesel and kerosene were USD 591/MT, USD 521/MT and USD 518/MT which is equivalent to an increase of 12%, 29% and 33% respectively, when compared to the average FOB prices of 2020. The world market FOB prices for petrol, diesel and kerosene/ Jet A-1 are illustrated n **Table 10** and **Figure 7**.

4.2 Domestic Petroleum Product Prices

In the year under review, the Authority continued to regulate the petroleum industry in all aspects, including pricing of petroleum products. The domestic wholesale and retail cap prices of petrol, diesel and kerosene were published on a monthly basis for all districts in mainland Tanzania. The prices were determined by considering the product costs at the receiving ports, which include landed costs, local costs, and Government taxes. The computation of petroleum cap prices also provides margins to wholesalers and retailers to cover operating costs and a return on investment.




Figure 8: Average Pump Prices for Dar es Salaam in 2020 and 2021

In the year 2021, the average pump prices in Dar es Salaam for petrol, diesel and kerosene were TShs 2,241 per litre, TShs 2,109 per litre and TShs 2,016 per litre respectively, which is an increase of 16%, 13% and 14% when compared to the average pump prices in 2020. **Table 11** provides the monthly pump prices for Dar es Salaam and **Figure 8** shows the average retail pump prices for Dar es Salaam in 2020 and 2021.




Figure 9: Average Pump Prices for Tanga in 2020 and 2021

In the year 2021, Tanga port continued to receive petrol and diesel. Prices of kerosene for Tanga and other northern regions are based on products received at Dar es Salaam port. Based on the cost of products received through Tanga port, the average pump prices at Tanga were Tshs 2,287/Litre, Tshs 2,134/Litre and Tshs 2,110/Litre for petrol, diesel and kerosene respectively. This is equivalent to an increase of prices by 20%, 15% and 5% respectively when compared to the average pump prices in 2020. **Table 12** provides the monthly pump prices for Tanga and **Figure 9** indicates the comparison in graphical presentation of the average pump prices for Tanga in 2020 and 2021.




Figure 10: Average Pump Prices for Mtwara in 2020 and 2021

Similarly, Mtwara port continued to receive petrol and diesel only. Kerosene for Mtwara and other southern regions is priced based on products received at Dar es Salaam port. The average pump prices for Mtwara, based on the cost of products received through Mtwara port were Tshs 2,258/Litre, TShs 2,114/Litre and Tshs 2,088/Litre for petrol, diesel and kerosene respectively, equivalent to an increase of 11%, 9%, and 13% respectively compared to average pump prices of 2020. **Table 13** provides the monthly pump prices for Mtwara and **Figure 10** presents the average pump prices for Mtwara in 2020 and 2021.


4.2.1 Exchange Rate

The currency used in procurement of petroleum products is the United States Dollar (USD). As the products are sold in the Tanzanian market in the local currency, an exchange rate is determined each month during computation of petroleum products prices so as to convert the foreign currency to the local currency. In determination of the exchange rate, EWURA sources from the Bank of Tanzania the prevailing exchange rate obtained by Oil Marketing Companies when sourcing Dollars to pay for the products received at the storage terminals.

During the period under review, the average exchange rate was TShs 2,324 per USD, indicating a -0.3% depreciation of the Shilling against the Dollar, compared to TShs 2,331 per USD in 2020. **Table 14** and **Figure 11** present the exchange rates in 2020 and 2021.

4.2.2 Demurrage Costs





Figure 12: Demurrage Days and Unit Demurrage Cost at Dar es Salaam, Tanga and Mtwara ports

Demurrage costs are the charges payable to petroleum suppliers due to delays in discharging petroleum products based on an agreed time as specified in the shipping and supply contracts. **Figure 12** shows the trend of unit demurrage costs and demurrage days for the three ports. It may be noted that Dar es Salaam port has the highest demurrage days due to congestion of vessels mainly at KOJ₁. On the other hand, demurrage days at Mtwara port were the lowest due to the fact that there is no congestion at the port. Most of the delays are due to waiting time for laboratory results that are processed in Dar es salaam after sampling.

Nonetheless, despite having the lowest demurrage days which leads to low demurrage costs, the unit demurrage cost at Mtwara is the highest as shown in **Figure 12**. This is due to the small amount of petroleum products discharged at Mtwara port.

The average unit demurrage costs at Dar es Salaam port increased from 2.60 USD/MT in 2020 to 3.35 USD/MT in 2021 while demurrage days also increased from 6.52 days in 2020 to 9.46 days recorded in 2021.

The average unit demurrage costs at Tanga port decreased from 2.39 USD/MT in 2020 to 1.96 USD/MT in 2021, equivalent to a decrease of 18%. Furthermore, the average demurrage days decreased from 3.40 to 2.69.




Figure 14: Tanga Port Demurrage Cost (USD/MT) and Demurrage Days

The average unit demurrage cost at Mtwara port decreased from 9.39 USD/MT in 2020 to 7.86 USD/MT in 2021. On the other hand, demurrage days have also increased from 1.30 in 2020 to 2.19 days in 2021. The unit cost is high due to low quantities of petroleum products imported through Mtwara port. The cost is expected to decline when more quantities are imported through the port, especially when transit products to neighbouring countries in southern parts of the country start being imported through Mtwara port.




Figure 15: Mtwara Port Demurrage Cost (USD/MT) and Demurrage Days

4.2.3 Relationship Between FOB Prices and Local Pump Prices




Figure 16: Relationship between Petrol FOB and Pump Prices in 2021

Tanzania is a net importer of petroleum products as there are no petroleum products that are produced locally. Being a net importer country, fluctuations of refined petroleum products prices in the world market ultimately affect local pump prices. The relationship between FOB prices of refined petroleum products and local pump prices during the period under review is illustrated in **Figure 16** to **Figure 18**. The trend shows that local pump prices for diesel, petrol and kerosene move directly proportional to FOB prices.




Figure 17: Relationship between Diesel FOB and Pump Prices in 2021




Figure 18: Relationship between Kerosene FOB and Pump Prices in 2021

4.3 Market Share of Oil Marketing Companies

The Authority continued to monitor competition among oil marketing companies in the country. Operators are allowed to expand their business operations to whatever levels in their capacities, provided that they do not breach the rules, licence terms and conditions. Operators are free to enter or exit the market, engage in mergers, acquisitions, re-branding or business promotions. Anti-competitive practices, including distortion of fuel quality standards, selling petroleum products beyond cap prices and breaching HSE practices were restricted and legal actions taken against dishonest players.

In the year under review, the petroleum market in the country remained competitive and fairly distributed among different Oil Marketing Companies (OMCs). Five dominating OMCs occupied 51.6% of the total market share. These are Puma Energy Tanzania Ltd (14.0%), Total Energies Tanzania Ltd (13.1%), and Gulf Bulk Petroleum Tanzania Ltd (8.5%) Mansoor Industries Limited (8.5%) and Oryx Energies (7.5%), while the remaining OMCs shared the remaining portion. Factors attributed to the five OMCs dominating a big market share include ownership of downstream supply chain, customer brand loyalty, distribution of petroleum products and supply contracts with big consumers, such as industries, mining and agriculture companies. The market share of all OMCs is as shown in **Table 16**.

5. INFRASTRUCTURE AND SUPPLY OF LIQUEFIED PETROLEUM GAS

5.1 LPG Facilities

LPG facilities include receiving and storage facilities, LPG cylinder re-filling plants and LPG cylinders distribution warehouse. In the country, LPG is mainly received through Kurasini Oil Jet 2 (KOJ₂) in Dar es Salaam port and a smaller quantity is received through Tanga port.

In the year 2021, there was no new investment in LPG receiving facilities. Therefore, the total storage capacity for LPG receiving facilities in Dar es Salaam and Tanga remained at 15,750 MT as presented in **Table 17**. Similarly, the upcountry LPG storage facilities for re-filling plants also remained at 1,522 MT as it was reported in the previous year. However, there are ongoing constructions of LPG re-filling plants in upcountry regions, including Lindi and Mtwara. **Appendix 6** shows the list of LPG storage capacities available countrywide.



5.2 LPG Imports

In the year under review, the LPG business segment continued to grow with LPG imports increasing by 28% to 248,216 MT compared to 194,597 MT imported in 2020. The increase in the quantity of imported LPG is attributed to increased LPG consumption, following efforts done by the Government and LPG marketing companies to raise public awareness on the importance and convenience of using LPG instead of traditional cooking fuels such as charcoal, firewood and kerosene. In order to increase consumption of LPG especially for cooking in households, LPG is available at different cylinder sizes from 3kg to 15kg cylinders. For convenience of cooking in restaurants, cylinders of up to 40kg are also available in the market. Out of the total imported LPG, locally consumed LPG was recorded growing to 136,652 MT compared to 121,834MT consumed in 2020. Apart from local consumption, the LPG export business is also booming. In average, about 111,563 MT of the imported LPG was exported to neighbouring countries compared to 102,375 MT exported in 2020. **Table 18** presents LPG imports in 2021 whereas **Figure 19** indicates the LPG imports trend from 2010 to 2021.

5.3 Monitoring Market Share of Liquefied Petroleum Gas Marketing Companies

The Authority also continued to monitor LMCs performances in the market with respect to Liquefied Petroleum Gas (LPG) sales levels attained by each company in the market. In the year under review, Oryx Gas Tanzania emerged as market leader with 46% market share, followed by Taifa Gas Tanzania Limited with 23% market share. Manjis Gas ranked third with 11% market share, followed by Lake Gas Ltd in fourth place with a market share of 9%. The remaining LMCs, including Oilcom Gas, Orange Gas and Mount Meru Gas, shared the remaining portion as indicated in **Table 19**.

In the year under review, regional LPG consumption varied from zone to zone. The Coastal Zone which comprises Dar es Salaam, Coast, Morogoro, Mtwara, Lindi and Ruvuma regions was the leader with average LPG consumption of 49% of the total consumption, followed by the Northern Zone with average consumption level of 19%. The Northern Zone comprises Arusha, Kilimanjaro, Manyara and Tanga regions. On the other hand, the Lake Zone (Mwanza, Mara, Geita, Shinyanga, Kagera and Simiyu) had an average consumption rate of 15%. The Southern and Southern Highland Zone (Iringa, Njombe, Mbeya, Katavi, Rukwa and Songwe) had a consumption level of 10%. The remaining portion of 9% was consumed by regions of Dodoma, Singida, Kigoma and Tabora, making up the Central Zone. Depending on competitive advantages including distribution network extensiveness, brand image or loyalty and sales discounts, LMCs had a way to penetrate the regions to win sales share of LPG supply in the country as indicated in **Table 19**.

The Government in collaboration with LPG Marketing Companies and other key stakeholders including the Rural Energy Agency continued to promote the use of LPG as an alternative source of energy especially in rural areas and in areas with low consumption.

6. SUPPLY OF LUBRICANTS

The supply of lubricants in the country comes from two sources - direct imports and lubricants that are locally blended at lubricant blending plants located in Tanzania. Currently, there are six (6) lubricant blending plants, namely Oryx Service and Specialities Ltd, Total (T) Ltd, Mineral Oil Ltd, General Petroleum Ltd, Lake Lubes Ltd and Mogas (T) Ltd. The quantity of lubricants supplied into the market in the year 2022 was 55,516,988 litres, whereas 47,340,517 litres, equivalent to 85%, was blended at the aforementioned blending plants and 8,176,471 litres, equivalent to 15%, was imported.

The lubricant supply market is led by Total (T) Ltd with a market share of 34.9%, followed by Oryx Services and Specialities (25.9%), Mineral Oil Ltd (11.5%), Mogas Tanzania Ltd (6.5%) and General Petroleum Ltd (5.1%).




Figure 20: Contribution of Imported and Local Blended Lubricants in 2021




Figure 21: Locally Blended and Imported Lubricants in 2021

7. LICENSING ACTIVITIES

Pursuant to Section 131(1) of the Petroleum Act, Cap 392, any person who intends to undertake a regulated activity is required to apply to EWURA for a licence. The petroleum licenses that are issued by the Authority include petroleum wholesale, petroleum storage, retail outlets commonly known as petrol stations, LPG distribution and lubricants wholesale to mention a few. For smooth implementation of this obligation, EWURA processes licences through its online application system namely, **License and Order Information System (LOIS)** which is accessed through the EWURA website www.ewura.go.tz or <https://lois.ewura.go.tz/ewura/home>.

In the year 2021, EWURA issued a total of 531 licences, which is equivalent to an increase of 3.3% compared to 514 licences issued in 2020. Out of 531 licences, 207 licences were issued to new applicants, whereas 324 licences were renewed.

In a bid to improve the supply of quality petroleum products in rural areas, EWURA continued to encourage the construction of low-cost petrol stations in rural areas. On the other hand, EWURA continued issuing conditional licences to rural petrol stations that met the minimum technical requirements without jeopardising HSE standards. In the year under review, out of 207 new licences, 84 licences were issued to petrol stations located in rural areas, whereas 35 of them were conditional licences. As of December 2021, the Authority has issued 279 licenses to petrol stations located in rural areas.

A summary of licences issued in 2021 is displayed in **Table 21**, whereas the list of applicants that were granted licences in 2021 is presented in **Appendix 7**. The Authority will continue to issue licences to qualified applicants who intend to or are undertaking petroleum-regulated activities.

8. COMPLIANCE MONITORING AND ENFORCEMENT

During the period under review, EWURA conducted compliance monitoring programmes in various regulated areas with the objective of ensuring that operators in the mid and downstream petroleum subsector comply with the applicable laws, rules, standards and the best petroleum industry practices along with the petroleum supply chain. Compliance monitoring was undertaken on product quality, fuel marking, fuel marker detection, infrastructure standards, HSE standards as well as petroleum cap prices.

EWURA continued to enforce compliance in all regulated areas and legal action was taken against operators who were non-compliant to applicable laws and rules. Sections 8.1 to 8.10 present the monitoring programs and enforcement taken by the Authority in the year under review.

8.1 Monitoring Compliance to Petroleum Infrastructure Standards

In the year 2021, EWURA continued to conduct regular and ad hoc compliance monitoring inspections on different petroleum facilities across the country in order to monitor compliance with the standards, licence terms and conditions, applicable laws, HSE requirements and best petroleum industry practices. The facilities that were inspected for compliance monitoring included petrol stations, petroleum storage depots, petroleum consumer installations, LPG storage and filling plants, LPG super dealers' warehouses, lubricant blending plants and lubricant wholesalers' warehouses.

During the period under review, 809 facilities were monitored, out of which, 495 facilities complied with licence terms and conditions, applicable laws, HSE requirements and best petroleum industry practices. The compliance level in 2021 was 61% compared to 71% attained in 2020. Legal action was taken against facilities that were found to be non-compliant, including closure of the facilities until the respective operators rectified anomalies. The Authority will continue to conduct regular compliance monitoring and enforcement in order to ensure all petroleum facilities in mainland Tanzania are operated under a high level of compliance. The Authority will also continue to raise the awareness of petroleum operators and the general public on compliance issues.

8.2 Monitoring Compliance to Petroleum Products Quality

As per Section 30(2) (b) of the Petroleum Act, Cap 392, EWURA has been mandated to monitor petroleum quality and standards. Similarly, section 179(1) of the same Act stipulates that, a person shall not distribute petroleum products unless such petroleum products conform to quality, safety and environmental specifications set out in the regulations made by the Minister. In implementing the above-mentioned function, EWURA has been conducting quality checks on petroleum products in accordance with the Petroleum (Sampling and Testing) Rules, 2010, GN No. 211. During the period under review, the Authority collected 942 samples from petroleum facilities. Quality tests for the collected samples were conducted at accredited laboratories to check for conformity of the products to Tanzanian standards.

Out of the 942 collected samples, 58 samples, equivalent to 6.16% did not conform to acceptable standards. In comparison, in 2020 the Authority collected 558 samples, out of which 68 samples, equivalent to 12.19% did not conform to TBS specifications. This translates that the level of compliance to petroleum products quality specifications in 2021 was 93.84% compared to 87.81% in 2020, equivalent to a 6.03% increase of quality compliance. The Authority will continue to put more effort to ensure high level of compliance is attained at all times and hence only quality petroleum products are supplied into the market. **Figure 22** presents a 10-year trend of non-conformity to petroleum products quality from year 2011 to year 2021.

Legal action was taken against petroleum operators found with non-conforming petroleum products in accordance with Section 179(2) (a) and (c) of the Petroleum Act, Cap 392. The legal action included closure of the facilities, payment of requisite fines and blending of the non-conforming products

8.3 Monitoring Compliance with Fuel Marking Programs

In the fight against dumping of transit, tax-exempted and smuggled petroleum products into the local market, EWURA continued to oversee the implementation of the fuel marking program since its inception in September 2010. The marking program is done pursuant to the Petroleum Products (Marking and Quality Control) Rules, 2010, GN. No. 210.

The Authority continued monitor the fuel marking program to ensure that it is executed in accordance with the Petroleum Products (Marking and Quality Control) Rules, GN. No. 210. Under the period of review, a total of 3,560,695.945 litres of petroleum products were marked, compared to 3,373,149,045 litres reported in 2020, equivalent to an increase of 5.6%. The volume of petrol marked in 2021 was 1,463,358,088 litres, which is an increase of 2.1%, while the volume of marked diesel was 2,073,237,328 litres, which is an increase of 8.8%. The increase

in the volume of marked petroleum products is an indicator of growth in demand for petroleum, which emanates mainly from growth of economic activities and human wellbeing.

On the other hand, the total volume of marked kerosene declined by 30.4% to a reported volume of 24,100,529 litres. The continued decrease of the marked volume of kerosene is attributed to the following main factors: availability and accessibility of affordable alternative energy sources including LPG, solar energy and electricity that were partly facilitated by an intensive rural electrification program. Similarly, the decline of marked volume of kerosene is also due to compliance monitoring and enforcement done by the Authority to curb adulteration of petroleum products, which may be done by mixing kerosene with other petroleum products. **Table 22** presents monthly marked volume in 2021 whereas **Figure 23** demonstrates the trend of marked volumes of kerosene from year 2012 to year 2021. The observed low quantity of marked volume for the month of April as presented in **Table 22**, is attributed to the transition period during the change of the marking service provider from Global Fluid International (GFI) to Tanzania Bureau of Standards (TBS), whereby thirteen (13) days passed without executing the fuel marking program.

8.4 Compliance Monitoring of Fuel Marker Concentration Levels

The Authority continued to monitor marker concentration levels in three major petroleum products namely, diesel, petrol and kerosene, which are marked under the fuel marking program. To achieve this, the Authority conducted periodic and ad-hoc inspections and collected samples from different petroleum facilities across the country for the purpose of conducting fuel marker detection tests. The tests were conducted in accordance with the Petroleum Product (Marking and Quality Control) Rules, 2010, GN 210.

In 2021, the Authority conducted fuel marker detection tests on 709 petroleum facilities compared to 643 facilities that were marker-tested in 2020. Out of 709 tested facilities, 75 facilities, equivalent to 10.58% failed the tests compared to only a 3.27% failure rate recorded in 2020. This relatively higher failure rate in 2021 caused the compliance level to fuel marking to decrease from 96.73% achieved in 2020 to 89.42% recorded in the year under review. **Figure 24** demonstrates the trend of fuel marker failure from 2014 to 2021.

Legal action was taken by the Authority against operators who were found with non-conforming petroleum products, pursuant to the Petroleum Product (Marking and Quality Control) Rules, 2010. These included closure of the facilities and payment of the requisite fines to the Authority. Operators who were found with tax-exempted and transit petroleum products were referred to the Tanzania Revenue Authority (TRA) for payment of evaded taxes and other penalties as per the relevant customs laws.

The Authority will continue conducting surveillance monitoring on petroleum facilities so as to crack down on illegal operators who are selling/offering for sale petroleum products that do not conform to the Petroleum (Marking and Quality Control) Rules, GN No. 210.

8.5 Monitoring Compliance with Price Setting Rules

As per Energy and Water Utilities Regulatory Authority (Petroleum Products Price Setting) (Amendments) Rules, 2017 GN. 163, the Authority continued to publish and monitor the compliance of petroleum cap prices. The petroleum products cap prices are computed monthly and issued to the public on the first Wednesday of every month. For year 2021, the Authority conducted compliance monitoring of cap price to 1,196 petrol stations across the country. No single petrol station was found selling the products above the cap prices, translating that the level of compliance to cap price for the year under review to be 100% compared to 99.83% achieved in 2020. The Authority will continue to monitor compliance to cap prices and ensure that 100% compliance level is maintained at all times.

8.6 Monitoring Facilities Constructed Without Construction Approvals

The Authority, under the Petroleum Act, Cap 392, is mandated to issue construction approval to any developer who intends to build petroleum facilities in the mid and downstream petroleum subsector. This mandate is provided in Section 126(1) of the Petroleum Act, Cap 392, which states that any person intending to construct a petroleum installation or petroleum carriage facility is required to apply in writing to EWURA for an approval. On the other hand, Section 127(1) of the Petroleum Act prohibits construction of petroleum installations without an approval from EWURA, while Section 127(2) of the same legislation provides penalties of not less than twenty million shillings (Tzs 20,000,000) or imprisonment for a term of not less than 3 years, or both, to a person that contravene the aforementioned requirement.

In 2021, the Authority evaluated and approved a total of 263 applications for construction approvals, which is equivalent to an increase of 6% compared to 248 construction approvals granted in 2020. All applications for construction approvals for petrol stations were granted, with the exception of one approval, which was issued to the developer of an LPG storage and re-filling plant to be built at Vijibweni Industrial area, Kigamboni Municipality, in Dar es Salaam region. **Appendix 8** shows the list of developers who were granted construction approvals.

On the other hand, the Authority continued to conduct compliance monitoring on various petroleum facilities that were under construction. During the period under review, a total of 14 new facilities were found being constructed without approval from the Authority. This is equivalent to a decrease of 53% compared to 30 facilities found being built without approval from the Authority in 2020. **Appendix 9** presents a list of petroleum installations that were constructed without construction approvals in 2021. Punitive measures were taken against defaulters in accordance with Section 127(2) of the Petroleum Act, Cap 392 and Rule 4(4) of the Petroleum (Wholesale, Storage, Retail and Consumer Installations Operations) Rules, 2020. The Authority will continue to conduct awareness and enforce the rules to ensure compliance.

8.7 Monitoring Compliance to HSE in Petroleum Operations and Transportation

As provided in Sections 30(1) (i) and 30(1) (k) and Section 179 (1) of the Petroleum Act, Cap 392, the Authority is required to ensure that all operators of petroleum and gas facilities operate in a manner that does not pose a threat to public health, safety and the environment (HSE). In compliance with the above-mentioned legal requirements, the Authority continued to conduct compliance monitoring to HSE requirements on petroleum facilities and operators across Tanzania mainland.

In 2021, a total of eight (8) persons/businesses were found undertaking liquefied petroleum gas (LPG) operations in a manner that is detrimental to HSE requirements. Out of eight (8), five (5) persons were found conducting illegal re-filling of LPG cylinders contrary to Rule 32 of the Petroleum (Petroleum Liquefied Gas Operations) Rules, 2020, GN. No. 825. These five incidents occurred in Dar es Salaam and Kilimanjaro regions. The remaining three (3) operators were found storing LPG cylinders and conducting LPG business in residential premises in Singida, Kilimanjaro and Dar es Salaam regions. The Authority seized the LPG cylinders found at the site and handed over the same to respective suppliers to keep them in safe custody. The Authority has taken legal action against the individuals found undertaking LPG operations in a manner that is detrimental to HSE requirements. The Authority will continue to undertake planned and ad-hoc inspections to monitor compliance to HSE requirements. **Table 23** offers a summary of operators that were found operating contrary to HSE requirements, whereas **Figure 25**, **Figure 26** and **Figure 27** show pictures of some illegal re-filling incidents captured during the inspections.

9. ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT ASSESSMENT AND AUDIT REVIEW

The Environmental Management Act, 2004 and the Environmental Impact Assessment and Audit Regulations, 2005 require a project developer or proponent to conduct environmental impact assessment and audit studies. EIA studies are conducted prior to the commencement or financing of a project or undertaking, while environmental audit studies are carried out after commencement of operations. The regulations further prohibit any licensing authority in mainland Tanzania to issue a licence unless the applicant produces to the licensing authority an Environmental Impact Assessment Certificate issued by the minister responsible for the environment.

In compliance with the Environmental Management Act, from January to December 2021, the Authority reviewed 189 Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) and Environmental Audit (EA) studies received from project proponents and operators in the petroleum downstream subsector. The Authority gave feedback about its concerns and views regarding the studies for inclusion in technical advisory meetings (TACs) held by NEMC before consideration for issuance of EIA Certificates. Compared to the year 2020, where the Authority reviewed 111 EIA and EA studies, there was a 70% increase in 2021, which translates into a high compliance level on the Environmental Management Act, 2004 as well as compliance to the regulatory requirement of obtaining construction approval before commencing construction of a project.

10. INCIDENT INVESTIGATIONS

During the period under review, the Authority continued to investigate incidents focusing on identifying their causes and recommending corrective action so that controls can be put in place to prevent recurrence of similar incidents in future. This is in accordance with Section 30(2) (o) of the Petroleum Act, Cap 392 that requires the Authority to investigate incidents that result into damage of infrastructure, injury or loss of life or property.

During the year under review, a total of eleven (11) incidents were investigated, whereby seven of those incidents involved overturned road fuel tankers. One incident involved illegal connections to the 24-inch TPA diesel pipeline from the Single Buoy Mooring (SBM) to KOJ at Maweni Kisota area, Kigamboni Municipality in Dar es Salaam region, two incidents involved leakage of a petroleum pipeline, whereby one was a 24-inch pipeline owned by TPA near the Single Buoy Mooring (SBM) and the other was a diesel (AGO) receiving pipeline owned by Mansoor Oil Industries Limited (MOIL) traversing from Kurasini Oil Jetty (KOJ) to MOIL's terminal. The last incident involved a cargo truck (without a driver), which while waiting to deliver the cargo to TPA, accelerated from the parking lot at KOJ – Kitopeni area, hit the security guard who died and damaged TIPER's 14-inch AGO pipeline.




Figure 30: Some of the oil spills gathered at a seasonal water stream after an accident involving a road tanker with Reg. No. T610 DBY/T977 CRH at Maguha village, Dumila area, Kilosa district, in Morogoro region

The incidents occurred mainly due to mechanical failures of road tankers and loss of control of the tankers due to fatigue of the driver. The impacts emanating from overturned road tankers included product losses, damage to some of the trucks, injuries and one fatality. **Appendix 10** depicts a detailed description of the incidents that were investigated in the period under review while **Figure 28** through **Figure 30** show some of the pictures taken at the scenes of the incidents.

11. KEY ACHIEVEMENTS, CHALLENGES AND WAY FORWARD

The key achievements that were recorded in the mid and downstream petroleum subsector in the year 2021 are:

- (i) Petroleum products supply in the country has been stable as there were no shortages recorded for the whole period from January to December 2021;
- (ii) Increased number of petrol stations both in urban and rural areas, whereby conditional licenses have been issued to some facilities that meet the minimum required technical standards, provided that the facilities comply with all HSE standards. This has ensured that consumers of petroleum products in rural areas are able to obtain quality petroleum products in a convenient and safe manner;
- (iii) Petroleum products pricing and monthly price cap publications have been successful and stable. Petroleum prices have been published on the first Wednesday of each month;
- (iv) High compliance level to petroleum products price regulation, whereby the petroleum products were sold at or below the set cap prices;
- (v) Consumer confidence on quality assurance as they buy petroleum products at petrol stations as well as increased awareness of customers' rights to be supplied with products that meet quality standards and the knowledge of reporting any misconduct to EWURA.

In spite of the recorded achievements in the subsector, there are still challenges to be addressed, including:

- (i) Lack of a Single Receiving Terminal for white petroleum products that will ensure products are received within a short period of time and hence reduce demurrage costs. The presence of the terminal will also ensure security of supply by providing a larger storage facility;
- (ii) Despite the increase of petrol stations in rural areas, there is still a need for increased investments in petrol stations so as to eliminate the sale of petroleum products in plastic bottles and storage of the products in drums in residential houses which endangers the lives and properties of such business people and others in the surrounding areas;
- (iii) On smuggling of petroleum products from neighbouring countries, EWURA will continue to work with other Government institutions to curb such illegal activities, especially in border regions;
- (iv) Limited capacity of LPG offloading facility at Koj2, whereby the jetty is only capable of handling vessels with a maximum cargo of 5,500 MT, thus limiting the industry from achieving economies of scale in importation. Even though the total storage capacity is 15,750 MT, three vessels are required to deliver LPG that would utilise the full storage capacity;
- (v) High starter pack cost, which limits the increase of users of LPG, especially low income earners. The starter pack includes cylinders, burners and cookers. There is a need for LPG wholesalers to invest in LPG cylinders manufacturing plants in Tanzania or a source for affordable LPG cylinders that meet quality specifications in the international market; and
- (vi) Continued illegal re-filling of LPG cylinders, which is mostly done by decanting LPG from 38kg cylinders to 15kg cylinders and 6kg cylinders. This malpractice distorts fair competition in the market and poses imminent danger to health, safety and the environment. In order to control this malpractice, EWURA revised the LPG Operations Rules giving LPG wholesalers the obligation to monitor the movement of their cylinders which are above 16kg. The rules provide hefty penalties to those found conducting such practices and to wholesalers whose LPG cylinders are found to be used in decanting.

CONCLUSION

The petroleum mid and downstream subsector, in general, continues to perform well through the improvement and increased investments in infrastructure, growth in consumption of petroleum products and compliance to existing legislation. The Authority will continue to monitor the performance of the subsector to ensure availability, quality and affordability of petroleum products for the betterment of the lives of the people and enhanced contribution of the subsector to economic growth of the country. For maintainability and continuous improvement, the Authority shall:

- (i) Increase compliance monitoring activities to ensure operators comply with applicable regulations, rules and standards with regards to product quality, construction and operation of petroleum facilities in a manner that safeguards public health, safety and the environment.
- (ii) Continue with promotion of investments in low-cost petrol stations for rural areas with the objective of improving quality and availability of petroleum products in rural areas;
- (iii) Continue advocating the use of LPG and providing awareness to LPG operators, especially those distributing and handling LPG cylinders, as well as development of promotional materials for each market segment down to end-users; and
- (iv) Engage with other Government institutions to address challenges in LPG offloading facilities and LPG regulatory matters.
