**PUBLIC NOTICE ON CAP PRICES FOR PETROLEUM PRODUCTS EFFECTIVE  
WEDNESDAY, 7<sup>th</sup> JANUARY 2015**

The Energy and Water Utilities Regulatory Authority (EWURA) hereby publishes monthly cap prices for petroleum products, applicable in Tanzania Mainland. These retail and wholesale prices are applicable effective **Wednesday 7<sup>th</sup> January 2015**. Kindly take note of the following:

- (a) Retail and wholesale petroleum products prices, in Tanzania Mainland have decreased as compared with prices in the publication of 3<sup>rd</sup> December 2014. Retail prices for Petrol, Diesel and Kerosene have decreased by TZS 74/litre or 3.63%, TZS 62/litre or 3.25% and TZS 54/Litre or 2.88% respectively. Likewise, wholesale prices for Petrol, Diesel and Kerosene have dropped by TZS 73.75/litre or 3.83%, TZS 62.08/litre or 3.44% and TZS 54.34/Litre or 3.04% respectively. The drop in the retail and wholesale local prices has been caused by a continued trend of falling World Oil Market prices.
- (b) Refined petroleum products in the world market, for Petrol, Diesel and Kerosene have dropped by a total of USD 249/MT, USD 189/MT and USD180/MT respectively in between the months of July and November2014 equivalent to a drop of 25%, 28% and 24% respectively. It may also be noted that in the period of September 2014 to January 2015, local market prices have dropped by a total of TZS 311/Litre, 244/Litre and 207/Litre respectively equivalent to 16%, 13% and 11% respectively. During the same period, the Tanzania shilling has depreciated by 4%. The drop in the local market prices would have been higher, had the local currency stabilized. It should also be noted that, on the average, CIF cost constitute about 60% of the local market pump prices, hence the fall in the world market prices cannot result in a one to one drop in the local market prices.
- (c) In line with the prevailing sector legislation, prices of petroleum products are governed by rules of supply and demand. EWURA shall continue to encourage competition in the sector by making available petroleum products pricing information including price cap. This information on prices is intended to enable stakeholders to make informed decisions on petroleum prices at any particular time.
- (d) Oil marketing companies are free to sell their products at a price that give them competitive advantage, provided that such **price does not exceed the price cap for the relevant product. The approved formula was gazetted through Government Notice No. 354 of 26<sup>th</sup> September 2014.**
- (e) All petrol stations should publish petroleum product prices on clearly visible boards. The price boards should be clearly visible and should clearly show prices charged, discounts offered as well as any trade incentives or promotions on offer. Consumers are advised to purchase from

those stations that sell products at the most competitive prices. **It is an offence not to have prices published on boards located in clearly visible places in front of petrol stations and it will attract punitive measures from EWURA.**

- (f) Retailers must issue receipts with respect to all sales that they make and consumers are advised to **demand and keep receipts** that clearly show the name of petrol station, date on which such purchase was made as well as, the type of fuel and price per litre for every purchase they make. This can be used as an exhibit in case of a complaint lodged in the event that the selling price is above the cap price or in case the products sold are off the approved specifications.
