## PUBLIC NOTICE ON CAP PRICES FOR PETROLEUM PRODUCTS EFFECTIVE WEDNESDAY, 3<sup>rd</sup> FEBRUARY 2021

The Energy and Water Utilities Regulatory Authority (EWURA) hereby publishes Cap Prices for petroleum products, applicable in Tanzania Mainland. These retail and wholesale prices are applicable effective **Wednesday**, 3<sup>rd</sup> **February 2021**. Hereinafter, kindly take note of the following:

- (a) Retail and wholesale prices of petroleum products imported through **Dar es Salaam port** have changed compared to prices published on 6<sup>th</sup> January 2021. For February 2021, the retail price of Petrol, Diesel and Kerosene have increased by TZS 53/Litre (equivalent to 2.89 percent), TZS 134/litre (equivalent to 7.89%) and TZS 119/Litre (equivalent to 7.19 percent), respectively. Likewise, compared to the publication of last month, wholesale prices of Petrol and Diesel have increased by TZS 52.90/Litre (equivalent to 3.10 percent), TZS 133.36/litre (equivalent to 8.51 percent) and TZS 118.31/litre (equivalent to 7.77 percent), respectively.
- (b) For February 2021, retail and wholesale prices of Petrol and Diesel in the Northern regions (Tanga, Kilimanjaro, Arusha, and Manyara) have changed compared to prices published on 6<sup>th</sup> January 2021. For February 2021, retail prices of Petrol and Diesel have increased by TZS 91/litre (equivalent to 4.99 percent) and TZS 80/litre (equivalent to 4.54 percent) respectively. Similarly, compared to the publication of last month, wholesale prices of Petrol and Diesel have increased by TZS 90.92/litre (equivalent to 5.35 percent) and TZS 79.48/litre (equivalent to 4.89 percent), respectively. Kerosene prices shall continue to be the same as those that were published on 6<sup>th</sup> January 2021 because there was no new consignment of the product that was received through Tanga port in January 2021.
- (c) For February 2021, retail and wholesale prices of petroleum products for Southern regions (Mtwara, Lindi, and Ruvuma) have changed compared to prices published on 6<sup>th</sup> January 2021. For February 2021, retail prices of Petrol and Diesel have increased by TZS 71/litre (equivalent to 3.89)

- percent) and TZS 76/litre (equivalent to 4.34 percent), respectively. Similarly, compared to the publication of last month, wholesale prices of Petrol and Diesel have increased by TZS 70.98/litre (equivalent to 4.16 percent) and TZS 75.87/litre (equivalent to 4.67 percent), respectively..
- (d) Changes in local prices are mainly attributed to changes in the world oil market prices and BPS premiums.
- (e) EWURA would like to remind the public that these cap prices can be accessed through mobile phones by dialing \*152\*00# and then following the provided instructions. This service is free of charge and is available in all mobile phone service providers in the country.
- (f) In line with the prevailing sector legislation (Petroleum Act, 2015, section 166), prices of petroleum products are governed by rules of demand and supply. EWURA shall continue to encourage competition in the sector by making available petroleum products pricing information including cap prices. This information on prices is intended to enable stakeholders to make informed decisions on petroleum prices at any particular time.
- (g) Oil Marketing Companies are free to sell their products at a price that gives them a competitive advantage provided that, such **price does not exceed** the price cap for the relevant product as it is computed using the approved formula, which was gazetted through the Government Notice No. 656 published on 21st August 2020.
- (h) All petrol stations are required to publish petroleum product prices on clearly visible boards. The price boards should clearly show prices charged, discounts offered as well as any trade incentives or promotions on offer. Consumers are encouraged to purchase from stations that sell products at the most competitive prices and offer better services. It is an offense not to have prices published on boards located in clearly visible places in front of petrol stations. Failure to adhere to this directive will attract punitive measures from EWURA.
- (i) Retailers must issue receipts printed from an Electronic Fiscal Pump Printer (EFPP) for all sales that they make. In addition, consumers are required to demand and keep those receipts that clearly show the name of the petrol station, the date on which such purchase was made as well as, the type of petroleum product (fuel) and price per litre for every purchase they make. This can be used as an exhibit in case of a complaint lodged in the event that the selling price is above the cap price or in case the products sold do not meet the approved specifications and provide an assurance that appropriate government taxes on sales of petroleum products are fully
